
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CAPITAL CULTURAL HERITAGE AREA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. On October 2, 2003, governor Linda Lingle and
2 former mayor Jeremy Harris of the city and county of Honolulu
3 signed a joint proclamation establishing the Hawaii capital
4 cultural district. The designated area lies between Kalihi and
5 Piikoi streets, and Beretania street and the Pacific ocean. The
6 legislature passed House concurrent resolution no. 50, H.D. 1,
7 S.D. 1 (2004) designating the same area as the Hawaii capital
8 cultural district, as well.

9 The Hawaii Capital Cultural District Coalition, a nonprofit
10 organization, is a broad-based partnership of arts and cultural
11 organizations, businesses, public agencies, and community
12 members who share a vision of a vibrant and active central
13 Honolulu characterized by Hawaii's unique and diverse heritage,
14 cultures, and arts, and who look to become recognized as a
15 national heritage area by the national park service of the
16 United States Department of the Interior. The department of
17 business, tourism, and economic development is an active
18 participant in the coalition. Among the responsibilities of the



1 arts and culture development branch of the department of
2 business, economic development, and tourism is stimulating,
3 guiding, and promoting culture and the arts as a creative
4 economy and vibrant and sustainable sector of Hawaii's economy
5 throughout the State.

6 The purpose of this Act is to:

- 7 (1) Codify the designation of the Nu'uaniu ahupua'a area
8 bounded respectively by Kalihi and Piikoi streets, and
9 the Pali lookout and the Pacific ocean as the Hawaii
10 capital cultural heritage area; and
- 11 (2) Appropriate funds for the arts and culture development
12 branch of the department of business, economic
13 development, and tourism to plan and implement
14 programs and projects that recognize, preserve, and
15 celebrate the significance of the Hawaii capital
16 cultural district, recently named the Hawaii capital
17 cultural heritage area, to the heritage, culture, and
18 arts of Hawaii.

19 SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
20 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
21 read as follows:



1 "§9- Hawaii capital cultural heritage area. (a) There
2 is established a Hawaii capital cultural heritage area.

3 (b) The Hawaii capital cultural heritage area shall be the
4 Nu'uauu ahupua'a area in Honolulu, Oahu bounded respectively by
5 Kalihi street, Piikoi street, Pali lookout, and the Pacific
6 ocean.

7 (c) The arts and culture development branch of the
8 department of business, economic development, and tourism shall
9 encourage residents, government agencies, nonprofit
10 organizations, and private partners to collaboratively plan and
11 implement programs and projects that recognize, preserve,
12 stimulate, and celebrate the significance of the Hawaii capital
13 cultural heritage area to the heritage, culture, and arts of
14 Hawaii."

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the
18 arts and culture development branch of the department of
19 business, economic development, and tourism to plan and
20 implement programs and projects that recognize, preserve,
21 stimulate, and celebrate the significance of the Hawaii capital
22 cultural heritage area to the heritage, culture, and arts of



1 Hawaii, including efforts towards becoming recognized as a
2 national heritage area by the national park service of the
3 United State Department of the Interior.

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
5 business, tourism, and economic development for the purposes of
6 this Act.

7 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
9 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Appropriation; Hawaii Capital Cultural Heritage Area

Description:

Codifies the designation of the Nu'uanu ahupua'a area in Honolulu respectively between Kalihi and Piikoi streets, and Pali lookout and the Pacific ocean as the Hawaii capital cultural heritage area. Appropriates funds for the arts and culture development branch of the department of business, tourism, and economic development, to plan and implement programs and projects that recognize, preserve, stimulate, and celebrate the significance of the Hawaii capital cultural heritage area.
