A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HA'IKU VALLEY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Ha'iku valley on Oahu
has significant cultural and historic importance to the native
people of Hawai'i. Ha'iku valley is renowned for its
archaeological and other cultural and historic sites, including
lo'i, sacred sites, and burial sites, and for the presence of
native and endangered flora and fauna. Preserving the valley's
cultural and historic resources and educating the public about
these resources are of paramount importance.
The legislature further finds that ownership of the valley
is segmented among several entities. The valley's segmented
ownership and limited stewardship have placed its cultural and
historic resources at high risk. Adequate management and
appropriate access to the valley have proven elusive.
The purpose of this Act is to establish the Ha'iku Valley
cultural preserve commission, which shall have policy and
management oversight of the Ha'iku Valley cultural preserve. The
establishment of the commission will provide a system that



- 1 recognizes the valley's unique challenges and preserves in
- 2 perpetuity its cultural and historic resources for the people of
- 3 Hawai'i.
- 4 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 5 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 "CHAPTER
- 8 HA'IKU VALLEY CULTURAL PRESERVE
- 9 \$ -1 Administration of chapter. The Ha'iku valley
- 10 cultural preserve commission and the office of Hawaiian affairs
- 11 shall administer this chapter.
- 12 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
- 13 context otherwise requires:
- 14 "Commission" means the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve
- 15 commission.
- "Department" means the department of land and natural
- 17 resources.
- 18 "Office" means the office of Hawaiian affairs.
- 19 "Valley cultural preserve" means the area designated as
- 20 Ha'iku valley.

3	(1)	Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
4		permissible uses within the valley cultural preserve;
5	(2)	Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
6		pertaining to the valley cultural preserve;
7	(3)	Shall provide advice to the office, the governor, the
8		department, and other departments and agencies on any
9		matter relating to the valley cultural preserve;
10	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the
11		department of the attorney general on any matter
12		relating to the conveyance of the valley cultural
13		preserve to the office;
14	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with
15		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community
16		organizations for the perpetuation of native Hawaiian
17		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,
18		and practices for the purposes stated in section -3;
19	(6)	Shall carry out those powers and duties otherwise
20		conferred upon the board of land and natural resources
21		and the land use commission with regard to
22		dispositions and approvals pertaining to the valley

1		cultural preserve. All powers and duties of the board
2		of land and natural resources and the land use
3		commission concerning dispositions and approvals
4		pertaining to the valley cultural preserve shall be
5		transferred to the commission;

7		valley cultural preserve otherwise conferred upon the
8		city and county of Honolulu by chapter 205A;

12		natural resources with regard to proper treatment of
13		burial sites and human skeletal remains found in the
14		valley cultural preserve;
15	(9)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
16		are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and
17		shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
18		actions;
19	(10)	May delegate to the executive director or employees of

             -8 Penalty. Any person who violates any of the laws
    or rules applicable to the valley cultural preserve shall be

    $1,000, imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, for each

    offense. Each day of each violation shall be deemed a separate

    offense.
             -9 General administrative penalties. (a) Except as
18

    otherwise provided by law, the commission is authorized to set,
20
    charge, and collect administrative fines, or bring legal action
    to recover administrative costs of the commission or the
21

    department, or payment for damages, or for the cost to correct

- 2 adopted hereunder. The administrative fines shall be as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (1) For a first violation, a fine of not more than
- \$10,000;
- 6 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous
- 7 violation, a fine of not more than \$15,000; and
- **8** (3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years
- 9 of the last violation, a fine of not more than
- 10 \$25,000.
- 11 (b) In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000
- 12 may be levied for each specimen of natural resource or any
- 13 historic property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in
- 14 violation of any rule adopted under this chapter.
- 15 (c) Any criminal penalty for any violation of this chapter
- 16 or any rule adopted under this chapter shall not be deemed to
- 17 preclude the commission from bringing a civil legal action to
- 18 recover additional administrative fines and costs. Any civil
- 19 legal action against a person to recover administrative fines
- 20 and costs for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
- 21 under this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the State
- 22 from pursuing any criminal action against that person.



- (d) In any judicial proceeding to recover an
- 2 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show
- 3 that:
- 4 (1) Notice was given;
- 5 (2) A hearing was held or the time granted for requesting
- 6 a hearing has run without such a request;
- 7 (3) An administrative penalty was imposed; and
- 8 (4) The administrative penalty remains unpaid.
- 9 (e) For purposes of this section:
- 10 "Natural resource" includes any archaeological artifacts,
- 11 minerals, any aquatic life or wildlife or parts thereof,
- 12 including their eggs, and any land plants or parts thereof,
- 13 including seeds.
- "Historic property" means any building, structure, object,
- 15 districts, landscapes, area, or site, including heiau and
- 16 underwater sites, that is over fifty years old.
- 17 § -10 Administrative violation system. With the mutual
- 18 consent of both the commission and the department, the
- 19 commission may use the civil natural resource violations system
- 20 of the department of land and natural resources; provided that
- 21 the commission shall act whenever the board is authorized to

- 1 act, to process violations of this chapter or any rules adopted
- 2 hereunder.
- 3 § -11 Transfer. Upon its conveyance to the office, the
- 4 resources and waters of the valley cultural preserve shall be
- 5 held in trust by the office as part of the public land trust;
- 6 provided that the office shall transfer management and control
- 7 of the valley cultural preserve to the sovereign native Hawaiian
- 8 entity upon its recognition by the United States and the State.
- 9 All terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting the
- 10 valley shall remain in effect unless expressly terminated.
- 11 § -12 Ha'iku valley cultural preserve trust fund. (a)
- 12 There is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be
- 13 designated as the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve trust fund to
- 14 be administered by the office with the prior approval of the
- 15 commission. Subject to this chapter:
- 16 (1) All moneys received from the federal government for
- 17 purposes consistent with this chapter;
- 18 (2) Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the
- 19 trust fund;
- 20 (3) Any moneys received from grants, donations, or the
- 21 proceeds from contributions; and

- 1 (4) The interest or return on investments earned from
- 2 moneys in the trust fund,
- 3 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 4 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
- 5 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 6 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 7 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 8 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- 9 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 10 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 11 the trust fund is terminated.
- 12 (d) If the trust fund is terminated, all funds shall be
- 13 transferred to the general fund; provided that all unexpended or
- 14 unencumbered balances shall be disbursed in accordance with any
- 15 requirements set by funding sources and for purposes consistent
- 16 with this chapter.
- 17 (e) The commission shall submit an annual report on the
- 18 status of the Ha`iku valley cultural preserve trust fund to the
- 19 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 20 each regular session of the legislature. The annual report
- 21 shall include the total number of and amount of grants,

- 1 donations, and contributions received and balances remaining on
- 2 June 30 of each year.
- 3 § -13 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 4 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 5 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 6 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 7 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 8 provisions of this chapter are severable."
- 9 SECTION 3. The office of state planning and the department
- 10 of the attorney general, after consulting with the Ha'iku valley
- 11 cultural preserve commission, are authorized to initiate the
- 12 conveyance of all of the valley cultural preserve in fee simple
- 13 to the office of Hawaiian affairs; provided that before the
- 14 valley is conveyed to the office, agreements shall be executed
- 15 with respect to liability, monetary resources, and removal of
- 16 hazardous wastes.
- 17 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 20 the purposes of this Act, including but not limited to the
- 21 acquisition of the valley cultural preserve by the office of
- 22 Hawaiian affairs.



- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 2 Hawaiian affairs for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 4 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
