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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON AGING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to attract and  
2 retain highly qualified individuals by allowing the appointing  
3 authority to set the salary for the director of the executive  
4 office on aging.

5           SECTION 2. Section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

7           "(b) The head of this office shall be known as the  
8 director of the executive office on aging, hereinafter referred  
9 to as director. The director shall have professional training  
10 in the field of social work, education, public health, and other  
11 related fields; extensive direct experience in programs or  
12 services related to elders; and recent experience in a  
13 supervisory, consultative, or administrative position. The  
14 director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor  
15 without regard to chapters 76 and 89. Effective July 1, [~~2005~~]  
16 2008, the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing  
17 authority [~~that shall not exceed sixty-nine per cent of the~~



1 ~~salary of the director of human resources development]~~. The  
2 director shall be included in any benefit program generally  
3 applicable to the officers and employees of the State."

4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
