A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend Act 56, 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, that establishes a candidate 3 advisory council for the board of regents (board) of the 4 University of Hawaii in conformity with the amendment to article X, section 6 of the Hawaii Constitution, ratified by the voters 5 6 on November 7, 2006. Specifically, this Act: 7 (1) Clarifies that the name of the candidate advisory council is the "Regents Candidate Advisory Council" 8 9 (Council); 10 (2)Requires a board member, except the student member, to 11 reside in the geographic area represented by the 12 member: (3) Requires the governor to notify the Council of 13 14 vacancies on the board within ten days of receiving notification that a board member is resigning or has 15 16 died, or of removal by the governor;

1	(4)	Requires the submission of candidates within 60 days
2		of a vacancy on the board that arises by resignation,
3		death, or removal by the governor;
4	(5)	Clarifies that the Council is to submit the names of
5		candidates to the governor;
6	(6)	Makes confidential, information concerning potential
7		candidates that is not of public record; provided that
8		information relating to a candidate who is appointed
9		by the governor shall be disclosed; and
10	(7)	Appropriates funds to establish a permanent
11		administrative position for the Council.
12	SECT	ION 2. Section 26-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
14	" (a)	The University of Hawaii shall be headed by an
15	executive	board to be known as the board of regents.
16	The l	poard shall consist of fifteen members. At least one
17	member sha	all be a University of Hawaii student at the time of
18	the initia	al appointment. This member may be reappointed for one
19	additional	l term even though the member may no longer be a
20	student at	t the time of reappointment. The governor shall reduce

the terms of those initially appointed to each seat on the board

- 9 (4) Seven members from the city and county of Honolulu.
- 10 The board shall have the power, in accordance with the
- 11 [Constitution of the State] Hawaii Constitution and with law, to
- 12 formulate policy and to exercise control over the university
- 13 through its executive officer, the president of the university.
- 14 The board shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the internal
- 15 organization and management of the university."
- 16 SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 "\$304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;
- 19 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the
- 20 general management and control of the board of regents
- 21 consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be
- 22 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law,

- 1 (b) At its first meeting after June 30, the board of regents shall elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson, who 2 3 shall serve until adjournment of its first meeting after June 30 4 of the next year or thereafter until their successors are 5 appointed. The board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of the board. The president of the university shall 6 7 act as executive officer of the board. From May 1, 2007, and 8 until such time that the board of regents has at least fourteen 9 members, seven members of the board of regents shall constitute 10 a quorum to conduct business, and the concurrence of at least 11 seven members of the board of regents shall be necessary to make 12 any action of the board of regents valid; provided that upon 13 filling at least fourteen of the fifteen board of regents seats required under subsection (a), a majority of the board of 14 15 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the 16 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board 17 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten 18 19 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- (c) The governor shall notify the regents candidateadvisory council of the resignation, death, or removal of a

- 15 (a) There is established the regents candidate advisory council
- 16 for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to present
- 17 to the governor pools of qualified candidates from which the

- 19 with the consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The
- 20 regents candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria
- 21 for qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor

- 3 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), within sixty
- 4 days of convening its first meeting, the regents candidate

- 6 than four qualified candidates to the governor for each vacant
- 7 seat on the board of regents that has arisen due to resignation,
- 8 death, or removal by the governor; provided that for all

9		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
10		numbers of candidates.
11	(d)	In making its presentations, the <u>regents</u> candidate
12	advisory	council shall:
13	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
14		criteria to be applied and a description of the
15		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
16		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
17		candidates;
18	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
19		board of regents based on their background,
20		experience, and potential for discharging the
21		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;

1	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
2		solicit and accept applications from potential
3		candidates;
4	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
5		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
6		serve on the board of regents; and
7	(5)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or
8		anticipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or
9		any existing or anticipated financial transactions
10		with the University of Hawaii.

- 3 appointments of the initial members of the regents candidate
- 4 advisory council shall be deemed to begin on July 1, 2007,
- 5 regardless of the actual date of appointment.
- 6 (h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in
- 7 the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the
- 8 person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy
- 9 shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's
- 10 predecessor.
- 11 (i) The regents candidate advisory council shall operate
- 12 in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member
- 13 of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold
- 14 any elected office under the United States or the State or any
- 15 of its political subdivisions.
- 16 (j) The regents candidate advisory council shall convene
- 17 its first meeting on or after thirty-one days from May 1, 2007;
- 18 provided that, if thirty days after May 1, 2007, all the members
- 19 to which the regents candidate advisory council is entitled have
- 20 not yet been appointed, the regents candidate advisory council
- 21 shall convene its first meeting upon the appointment of a
- 22 majority of its members. The members of the <u>regents</u> candidate

- 1 advisory council shall choose a chairperson from among
- 2 themselves. A majority of all the members to which the regents
- 3 candidate advisory council is entitled shall constitute a quorum
- 4 to conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of all the

- 8 advisory council shall meet annually and at other times as

- 12 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 13 expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses,
- 14 necessary for the performance of their duties.
- (1) Information obtained, reviewed, or considered by the
- 16 regents candidate advisory council concerning potential
- 17 candidates that is not of public record shall be confidential;
- 18 provided that information concerning a candidate who is
- 19 appointed by the governor shall be disclosed as provided by law.

16	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general	
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$152,000 or so much	
18	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to	
19	establish a permanent administrative position for the regents	
20	candidate advisory council.	
21	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
22	Hawaii for	the purposes of this Act.

UH; Regents Candidate Advisory Council; Appropriation

Description:

Clarifies that the name of the candidate advisory council is the "Regents Candidate Advisory Council". Requires a UH Board of Regents member, except the student member, to reside in the geographic area represented by the member. Requires the Governor to notify the Council of vacancies on the BOR within 10 days of receiving notification that a BOR member is resigning or has died, or of removal by the Governor. Requires the submission of candidates within 60 days of a vacancy on the BOR that arises by resignation, death, or removal by the Governor. Clarifies that the Council is to submit the names of candidates to the Governor. Makes confidential information concerning potential candidates that is not of public record; provided that information relating to a candidate who is appointed by the Governor shall be disclosed. Appropriates funds to establish a permanent administrative position for the Council. (HB3226 HD1)
