
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 281, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§281- Techniques of alcohol management training. (a)
5 The commission may not issue a license, renewal license, or an
6 on or off premises license, or allow the transfer of a more than
7 fifty per cent interest in an existing on premises license
8 unless the applicant or transferee offers proof acceptable to
9 the commission that the applicant or transferee has employed or
10 presently employs on the licensed premises, at a minimum,
11 supervisory personnel and servers on each shift and during all
12 hours in which alcoholic liquor is served who have successfully
13 completed a techniques of alcohol management server training
14 program. The commission may deem an individual's enrollment and
15 active participation in a server training program as a
16 successful completion of the program for such time as the
17 individual is participating. The commission may allow an
18 applicant or a conditionally approved licensee at least one



1 hundred and eighty days, or more upon a showing of good cause,
2 to meet the minimum personnel training requirements of this
3 section. The commission may suspend the license of a
4 conditionally approved licensee for failure to comply with this
5 section.

6 (b) The techniques of alcohol management training program
7 shall be provided by a not-for-profit organization that shall
8 train point-of-sale personnel, and the topics of the program
9 shall cover, at a minimum:

- 10 (1) Clinical effects of alcohol;
- 11 (2) Methods of preventing second party sales of alcohol;
- 12 (3) Recognizing signs of intoxication;
- 13 (4) Methods to prevent underage drinking;
- 14 (5) Federal, state, and county laws that are relevant to
15 such personnel; and
- 16 (6) Consequences of section 291E-64 that creates a 0.02
17 per cent blood alcohol content limit for drivers under
18 twenty-one years of age.

19 (c) This section shall apply to the following classes of
20 licenses granted under section 281-31:

- 21 (1) Class 2. Restaurant license;
- 22 (2) Class 5. Dispensers' license;



1 (3) Class 10. Special license;

2 (4) Class 11. Cabaret license;

3 (5) Class 12. Hotel license;

4 (6) Class 13. Caterer license; and

5 (7) Class 14. Brewpub license."

6 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on October 1, 2008.
