A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that more children and

2 young adults die from suicide each year than from cancer, heart

3 disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, and chronic lung disease

4 combined. Nationally, over four thousand youths take their

5 lives annually, making suicide the third largest cause of death

6 of persons between the ages of ten and twenty-four.

7 In Hawaii, suicide is the second leading cause of death

8 among persons who are fifteen to twenty-four years old. Rates

9 of youth suicide have been on the rise in the last decade among

10 both females and males and among all ethnic groups. In Hawaii,

11 males are more likely than females to commit suicide, and native

Hawaiian youths are the most likely ethnic group to attempt or

13 commit suicide.

14 Research demonstrates that youth suicide is linked to

underlying mental health problems that can be addressed through

16 early intervention and prevention strategies. The legislature

17 notes that such intervention and prevention strategies have been

18 listed as a national health priority in dealing with rising



- 1 rates of youth suicide. Furthermore, Congress passed federal
- 2 legislation in 2004, and appropriated \$82,000,000 over the next
- 3 three years, for statewide programs designed to help prevent
- 4 youth suicide. Many states have already developed comprehensive
- 5 statewide youth suicide early intervention and prevention
- 6 strategies that seek to provide effective early intervention and
- 7 prevention services.
- 8 Suicide is a serious public health tragedy affecting
- 9 children and young adults in Hawaii. The legislature declares
- 10 that preserving and protecting the lives of children and young
- 11 adults is a priority for the State. The legislature further
- 12 finds and declares that preventing youth suicide is necessary
- 13 for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the
- 14 State. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 15 youth suicide early intervention and prevention program for
- 16 Hawaii.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 19 and to read as follows:
- 20 "§321- Youth suicide early intervention and prevention
- 21 program. (a) The department of health shall establish and
- 22 operate a statewide youth suicide early intervention and

2	limited t	o, persons between the ages of ten and twenty-four to:	
3	(1)	Create public awareness for issues relating to youth	
4		suicide prevention;	
5	(2)	Build community networks concerning youth suicide	
6		prevention; and	
7	(3)	Carry out training programs for suicide prevention for	
8		law enforcement personnel, providers of health care,	
9		school and University of Hawaii employees, and other	
10		persons who have contact with individuals at risk of	
11		suicide.	
12	(b)	The department of health shall provide appropriate	
13	research,	training, and technical assistance to carry out the	
14	purposes	of this section, including:	
15	(1)	Providing oversight on youth suicide early	
16		intervention and prevention strategies;	
17	(2)	Identifying and understanding causes and associated	
18		risk factors of youth suicide;	
19	(3)	Analyzing the efficacy of new and existing youth	
20		suicide early intervention techniques and	
21		technologies;	

1	(4)	Examining trends in youth suicidal behaviors and
2		nonfatal suicide attempts;
3	<u>(5)</u>	Evaluating and disseminating outcomes and best
4		practices of mental and behavioral health services at
5		institutions of higher education; and
6	(6)	Other activities deemed appropriate by the director of
7		health.
8	(c)	Research, training, and technical assistance resources
9	shall be	provided, but shall not be limited, to:
10	(1)	Political subdivisions of the State;
11	(2)	Native Hawaiian health and community organizations;
12	(3)	Institutions of higher education;
13	(4)	The department of education;
14	(5)	Public organizations;
15	(6)	Private nonprofit organizations; and
16	(7)	Health and social service organizations.
17	(d)	The department of health may develop and submit
18	proposals	for funding from federal agencies and private
19	organizat	ions to support the purposes of this section.
20	<u>(e)</u>	The department of health may adopt rules in accordance
21	with chapt	ter 91 to implement the purposes of this section."

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1 or so much thereof
- 3 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum
- 4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
- 5 for implementation of the statewide youth suicide early
- 6 intervention and prevention program established pursuant to
- 7 section 321- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 12 provided that this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2022.
