A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KAHUKU HOSPITAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Kahuku hospital has 2 been serving the residents of the north shore of Oahu from Kualoa to Waimea Bay, with a population of about twenty-seven 3 thousand, since 1929. Kahuku hospital is a twenty-five bed 4 5 facility that has provided an array of health care services 6 including emergency care, general acute care, surgery, skilled 7 nursing, ancillary care, and health education. It is one of nine hospitals in the state with a federal medicare designation 8 9 as a critical access hospital, which allows it to annually receive higher reimbursements amounting to about \$1,000,000 in 10 11 additional revenue.

12 On November 6, 2006, the board of directors of Kahuku 13 hospital voted to file for chapter 7 bankruptcy and close down 14 the hospital on December 31, 2006, because of continuing 15 operating losses of about \$1,500,000 a year, which has now 16 reached \$3,500,000. If such closure were to occur, the hospital 17 would lose its hospital license, its certificate of need, and 18 its critical access hospital designation, all of which would 18 HB843 HD1 HMS 2007-1799 Page 2

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1 require time and expense for another hospital to obtain, 2 effectively shutting down hospital-based health care services in 3 the area for an indefinite period. Closing down Kahuku hospital would pose a grave threat to the health and safety of all 4 5 residents on the north shore and windward areas of Oahu, who 6 would have to drive either twenty-two miles to Wahiawa general hospital or thirty-two miles to Castle Medical Center in Kailua 7 8 for hospital-based care, both trips requiring driving over an 9 hour along a single access road that is periodically closed by inclement weather or traffic mishaps. 10

Accordingly, the legislature finds that it is in the public interest to keep Kahuku hospital operating to serve the residents of the north shore of Oahu by enabling it to file for chapter 11 rather than chapter 7 bankruptcy, which would allow the hospital to:

- 16 (1) Continue operations;
- 17 (2) Preserve its hospital license;
- 18 (3) Retain its certificate of need and critical access19 hospital designation;
- 20 (4) Reorganize; and
- 21 (5) Settle its debts.



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1 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Hawaii health 2 systems corporation to bring Kahuku hospital under its 3 governance through formal affiliation with the corporation and 4 to provide for transitional facilitation by the director of 5 health. SECTION 2. Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 8 "§323F- Acquisition of Kahuku hospital. (a) Kahuku 9 10 hospital on Oahu may be assimilated into the Hawaii health 11 systems corporation in a manner and to an extent that may be negotiated. After assimilation, all the assets of Kahuku 12 13 hospital shall become the property of the corporation and Kahuku 14 hospital shall be operated by the corporation. 15 (b) None of the liabilities of Kahuku hospital shall 16 become liabilities of the corporation. 17 The corporation, at its discretion, may retain any or (C) 18 all medical and nonmedical employees of Kahuku hospital. 19 (d) The corporation, without regard to section 323F-31, 20 may adjust the levels of services provided by Kahuku hospital. 21 (e) Kahuku hospital shall be exempt from chapters 92 and 22 102 and section 103-53."



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1 SECTION 3. Kahuku hospital; acquisition by Hawaii health 2 systems corporation; transitional facilitation by the director 3 of health. The director of health, as an interested third party, shall act in the role of honest broker to help facilitate 4 5 the successful acquisition of Kahuku hospital by the Hawaii 6 health systems corporation during the transition period. 7 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to carry 10 out the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of necessary 11 staff. 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 13 health for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored. 15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval, 16 except that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2007, and 17 section 3 shall be repealed upon: 18 (1) The receipt of a letter by the director of health from 19 the corporation board of the Hawaii health systems 20 corporation officially notifying the director of 21 health that the acquisition of Kahuku hospital by the 22 corporation has been successfully completed; and
