HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ESTABLISH AN INMATE CONSERVATION CORPS PILOT PROGRAM ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources'
Youth Conservation Corps program helps participants develop a
sense of stewardship of the land and build valuable work
experience through community service, training, and education;
and

7 WHEREAS, a similar program utilizing Hawaii corrections 8 inmates as conservation corps participants could work to protect 9 and preserve Hawaii's natural environment and would prove to be 10 beneficial for the State; and

12 WHEREAS, inmates who have earned community custody status 13 can be educated and trained to help manage and protect Hawaii's 14 natural resources; and

16 WHEREAS, an inmate conservation corps can provide 17 assistance with trail maintenance, native plant restoration, 18 invasive species control, wildlife management, fence building, 19 stream and coastal restoration, and other conservation work; and 20 21 WHEREAS, being part of a conservation corps would encourage 22 beedewebic terms and encourage

21 WHEREAS, being part of a conservation corps would encourage 22 leadership, teamwork, communication, and responsibility among 23 the inmate participants; and 24

25 WHEREAS, an inmate conservation corps would ideally include 26 activities that promote:

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- The importance of responsibility, dependability, punctuality, and good attendance;
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1 Worksite relations skills, including taking (2)2 constructive criticism, working cooperatively with 3 other corps members and staff, and western and traditional Hawaiian job skills; 4 5 Life skills training, including instruction in (3) 6 7 conflict resolution, job search skills, personal money management, goal setting, and decision making; and 8 9 (4) Education for twenty hours each week on subjects such 10 as genealogy, Hawaiian language and traditional 11 12 practices, reading, math, communication skills, English language proficiency, academic preparation, 13 14 and work-specific skills; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 18 Land and Natural Resources and the Department of Public Safety 19 are requested to establish an inmate conservation corps pilot 20 21 program on the island of Hawaii to perform resource conservation 22 projects including, but not limited to, forest fire prevention, forest and watershed management, maintenance of recreation 23 24 areas, fish and game management, soil conservation, forest and 25 watershed re-vegetation, preventive maintenance or reconstruction of levees, or any other work necessary to prevent 26 27 flood damage; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 29 30 Natural Resources and the Department of Public Safety are 31 requested to select participants for the inmate conservation 32 corps pilot program that: 33 34 (1) Are classified as minimum security risk, are housed at a minimum security correctional facility, or have 35 attained community custody status; and 36 37 38 (2) Have completed appropriate basic education and training so as to be prepared for additional education 39 40 and training in natural resources conservation; and 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 42 43 Natural Resources and the Department of Public Safety are 44 requested to: 2
