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# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING NA KUPUNA O WAIANAE TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO  
ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN CHILDREN IN CHILD  
CUSTODY PROCEEDINGS.

1           WHEREAS, there is no resource that is more vital to the  
2 continued existence and integrity of native Hawaiians than their  
3 children; and

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5           WHEREAS, approximately 50 percent of the foster care cases  
6 under the jurisdiction of the Department of Human Services (DHS)  
7 involve native Hawaiian families; and

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9           WHEREAS, native Hawaiian communities have expressed concern  
10 that cultural needs are not being given the importance that they  
11 should, with regard to the placement of children in custody  
12 proceedings; and

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14           WHEREAS, the State should adopt a policy to protect the  
15 cultural and traditional interests of native Hawaiian children  
16 and promote the stability and security of native Hawaiian  
17 families; and

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19           WHEREAS, such a policy should include standards for the  
20 removal of native Hawaiian children from their families and the  
21 placement of these children in hanai or lawe hanai homes that  
22 will reflect the unique values of native Hawaiian culture; and

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24           WHEREAS, native Hawaiians should be provided assistance in  
25 navigating child and family service programs; and

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27           WHEREAS, H.B. No. 1895, H.D. 1, Regular Session of 2008,  
28 provides the framework for the Native Hawaiian Child Welfare  
29 Act, which establishes custody proceedings for native Hawaiian  
30 children; now, therefore,



1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
2 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
3 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that Na Kupuna O Waianae  
4 is requested to convene a task force to determine the  
5 feasibility of implementing the provisions of Part I of H.B. No.  
6 1895, H.D. 1; and

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8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Na Kupuna O Waianae is  
9 requested to include in the task force, representatives of the  
10 following:

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12 (1) DHS;  
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14 (2) The Office of Hawaiian Affairs;  
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16 (3) The Hawaii Foster Parent Association;  
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18 (4) The Hawaii Foster Youth Coalition;  
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20 (5) The Hawaii Youth Services Network;  
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22 (6) The Department of the Attorney General;  
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24 (7) Honolulu Community Action Program - Leeward District;  
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26 (8) The Legacy Coalition;  
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28 (9) Na Kupuna O Kahana; and  
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30 (10) Any other individuals or organizations DHS deems  
31 necessary;

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35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is also  
36 requested to examine the feasibility of DHS conducting a pilot  
37 project based on Part III of H.B. No. 1895, H.D. 1, which  
38 requires a pilot project of no more than 25 cases handled in  
39 accordance with procedures set forth in the bill; and  
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41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to  
42 submit an interim report on its activities to the Legislature no  
43 later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session  
44 of 2009 and a final report of its findings and recommendations,



1 including proposed legislation, if any, no later than 20 days  
2 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2010; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this  
5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human  
6 Services and Na Kupuna O Waianae.
