HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENTS OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO WORK TOGETHER TO DEVELOP A STANDARDIZED, WORKABLE POLICY TO PROTECT THE ELDERLY WITHOUT COMPROMISING RESIDENT CARE, AND THAT ENCOURAGES MORE PEOPLE TO BECOME ADULT RESIDENTIAL CARE HOME OR COMMUNITY CARE FOSTER FAMILY HOME OPERATORS.

1 2	WHEREAS, adult residential care home (ARCH) and community care foster family home (CCFFH) operators provide an invaluable
3	service to the greater community; and
5 6	WHEREAS, ARCH and CCFFH operators save taxpayers substantial sums of money that would otherwise be expended for
7 8	the care of the elderly and disabled if they were to become wards of the State; and
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10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, many operators are beset by tough challenges such as the high cost of liability insurance that threaten their continued existence; and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, caring for ARCH and CCFFH operators' clients is a profession that is becoming increasingly necessary in the face of Hawaii's ever-expanding elderly population; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, with the rising cost of living in Hawaii it has become increasingly common for multiple family members in a home to hold down several jobs leaving little time for the 24-hour care of an aging relative, increasing the need for ARCH and CCFFH facilities; and
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, assisted-living facilities are well beyond the financial reach of many families who need assistance with a loved one; and

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WHEREAS, it is estimated that by the year 2020, one in four 1 persons in this state will be over the age of 60, illustrating 2 the critical need for ARCH and CCFFH operators; and 3 4 WHEREAS, ARCH and CCFFH operators provide for all aspects 5 of a person's needs from scheduling of doctor's appointments or 6 physical therapy programs to providing social interaction with 7 those residents who no longer have family close by; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Departments of Health (DOH) and Human Services 10 11 (DHS) have overlapping jurisdiction over certain aspects of ARCHs and CCFFHs, including licensure, inspections, and 12 regulatory enforcement; and 13 14 WHEREAS, an ARCH or CCFFH that cares for chronically ill 15 16 residents needing skilled nursing care will be subject to DOH's medical-based guidelines as well as DHS's policies based on a 17 social services point of view; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, subjecting ARCH and CCFFH facilities to two sets of rules and policies causes confusion, which may negatively 21 22 influence a resident's care, and cause frustration to employees in jobs that are inherently stressful; now, therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 27 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that DOH and DHS are urged to work together to develop a standardized, workable 28 29 policy to protect the elderly without compromising resident care, and that encourages more people to become ARCH or CCFFH 30 31 operators; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 34 35 of Health, and Director of Human Services.
