STRONGLY URGING ENTITIES IN THE CRUISE INDUSTRY THAT OPERATE CRUISES VISITING THE STATE TO FULLY PARTICIPATE IN GOOD FAITH WITH THE ONGOING STUDY ENTITLED THE HAWAII CRUISE INDUSTRY STUDY, INTENDED TO ASSESS THE CURRENT AND POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF THE CRUISE INDUSTRY ON EACH ISLAND AND THE STATE UNTIL THE YEAR 2018.

WHEREAS, the State has funded a study, tentatively entitled 1 the Hawaii Cruise Industry Study, to assess the current and 2 potential impacts of the cruise industry on each island and the 3 State until the year 2018; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, ICF International and Menlo Consulting Group, Inc. are currently in the process of conducting this study, which 7 will be used by policymakers to assess the need, if any, to make 8 decisions in response to the cruise industry's impacts; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority and the Department of 11 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, in collaboration 12 with the Departments of Land and Natural Resources and 13 14 Transportation, represent the State in the ongoing study; and 15 WHEREAS, the study is planned to consist of nine modules as 16 follows: 17 18 19 (1) Assessment of cruise industry; 20 (2) Assessment of Hawaii's cruise industry; 21 22 23 (3) Impact on the economy; 24 25 (4) Impact on infrastructure and government services; 26 27 (5) Impact on the environment; 28
