HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO EVALUATE THE POSSIBILITY OF USING A CONSERVATION LAND TRUST IN THE ALA WAI WATERSHED AREA.

WHEREAS, the Ala Wai watershed is comprised of streams, 1 2 springs, and pools of water originating from the Ko'olau mountains; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, approximately 161,000 people reside in the Ala Wai watershed area, making it one of the most congested areas in the 6 7 State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, during heavy storms, the Ala Wai watershed swells 10 sending runoff and debris into the Ala Wai canal and adjoining areas; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the combination of public and private ownership of streamside and hillside properties in the Ala Wai watershed area 14 15 has hindered the development of integrated solutions and the reduction of downstream flooding and property damage in the 16 area; and 17 18 WHEREAS, efforts to plan an effective storm water and 19 20 pollution strategy for the Ala Wai watershed are also inhibited 21 by the population density; and 22 WHEREAS, to date, no report on the Ala Wai watershed has 23 focused on the possibility of using a conservation land trust on 24 private land to alleviate the downstream impact of storm water 25 , and pollution from the Ala Wai watershed; and 26 27 WHEREAS, conservation land trusts have been successful in 28 preserving private lands for public benefit in rural and 29 agricultural areas, and have provided tax benefits to the 30 31 participating private land owners; and



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1 2 WHEREAS, a conservation land trust in the Ala Wai watershed area that incorporates nonprofit land ownership and easements 3 may provide the means to establish a continuous corridor in 4 5 which to implement effective storm water and pollution improvements; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources 8 9 should evaluate the possibility of using a conservation land 10 trust in the Ala Wai watershed area to establish a continuous 11 corridor in which to implement effective storm water and pollution improvements; now, therefore, 12 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 15 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 16 Land and Natural Resources is requested to evaluate the 17 18 possibility of using a conservation land trust in the Ala Wai watershed area to establish a continuous corridor in which to 19 20 implement effective storm water and pollution improvements; and 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in evaluating the possibility 22 23 of using a conservation land trust in the Ala Wai watershed area, the Department of Land and Natural Resources, is requested 24 25 to: 26 Collaborate with the Ala Wai Watershed Association; (1) 27 28 Review the policy foundations for using a conservation 29 (2)land trust; 30 31 Review the use of conservation land trusts in relation 32 (3) to other watershed and storm water improvement 33 34 projects undertaken by the State, the City and County of Honolulu, the United States Army Corps of 35 Engineers, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, 36 37 and the Natural Resources Conservation Service; 38 39 (4)Make a technical assessment of the possibility of using a conservation land trust; and 40 41 (5) Solicit input from the local community; and 42 43

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board of Land and Natural Resources and the President of the Board of Directors and the Executive Director of the Ala Wai Watershed Association.
