HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII JOHN A. BURNS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE'S TELEHEALTH RESEARCH INSTITUTE TO FORM A TASK FORCE TO REVIEW THE POTENTIAL EXPANSION OF THE CURRENT PRACTICES AND EQUIPMENT OF HAWAII'S TELEMEDICINE SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, access to knowledgeable and qualified medical 1 doctors is arguably the single most important factor for people 2 to live long and healthy lives; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique geography as an island chain poses difficulties for patients seeking to access medical doctors 6 7 without incurring significant travel costs; and 8 9 WHEREAS, other states with access-to-care issues in isolated communities are exploring ways to ease difficulties for 10 both patients and medical doctors, by using methods that allow 11 both parties to travel no further than their own neighborhoods 12 13 to interact; and 14 15 WHEREAS, one approach to the access problem in Hawaii would 16 be to expand the state's relatively new telemedicine system, to include facilitation and coordination of cost effective health 17 care services and management of chronic diseases; and 18 19 WHEREAS, greater access to health care through telemedicine 20 would extend medical information and physicians' care throughout 21 the state, without requiring patients to leave their home 22 island; and 23 24 WHEREAS, after telemedicine was first implemented in 1998 25 by former Governor Benjamin Cayetano as a pilot project, it 26 became clear, even in its earliest stage, that there are endless 27 possibilities for telemedicine and associated health care 28 delivery to change lives for the better; and 29

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest for the residents 1 of Hawaii to continue to explore the possibilities of expanding 2 the current telemedicine and associated health care delivery 3 system to encompass the State's twelve hospitals; now, 4 therefore, 5 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 9 Session of 2008, that the University of Hawaii John A.
