HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO PROVIDE ADULT RESIDENTIAL CARE HOME OPERATORS WITH GREATER LEVELS OF SERVICE AND CONSIDERATION TO ASSIST THEM IN PROVIDING CARE FOR ADULTS.

WHEREAS, adult residential care home (ARCH) operators 1 provide an invaluable service to the greater community; and 2 3 WHEREAS, ARCHs save taxpayers substantial sums of money 4 that would otherwise be expended for the care of the elderly and 5 6 disabled, if they were to become wards of the State; and 7 WHEREAS, many operators are beset by many challenges such 8 as the high cost of liability insurance that threaten their 9 continued existence; and 10 11 WHEREAS, caring for the elderly and infirm is an honorable 12 profession that is becoming increasingly necessary in the face 13 of Hawaii's ever-expanding elderly population; and 14 15 WHEREAS, with the cost of living in Hawaii it has become 16 increasingly common for multiple family members in a home to 17 hold down several jobs which leaves little time for the 24-hour 18 care an aging relative may have; and 19 20 WHEREAS, it is estimated that by the year 2020 one in four 21 persons in this state will be over the age of 60; and 22 23 WHEREAS, many assisted living facilities are well beyond 24 the financial reach of some families who need assistance with an 25 aging loved one; and 26

WHEREAS, ARCH operators provide for all aspects of a 1 person's needs from scheduling of doctor's appointments or 2 physical therapy programs to providing social interaction with 3 those residents who no longer have family near to them to visit; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, considering the difficulty of operating an ARCH, and the tremendous services it provides to the State, it 8 behooves the Department of Health (DOH) to work with ARCH 9 operators to ensure a mutually beneficial and respectful 10 11 relationship; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, that Department of Health is urged to provide 15 ARCH operators with greater levels of service and consideration 16 to assist them in providing care for adults; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that ARCH operators have the right 19 to be treated with dignity, respect, trust, value, and 20 consideration as a primary provider of adult care and a member 21 of the professional team providing care; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that ARCH operators have the right 24 to proper training and support for the purpose of improving 25 skills in providing daily care and meeting the needs of the 26 adults in ARCH care; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that training, consultation, and 29 assistance in evaluating, identifying, and accessing services to 30 meet their needs related to their role as ARCH operators should 31 32 be made more available for those who wish to enter or continue in this profession; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that ARCH operators deserve the 35 right to provide input to DOH in identifying the types of 36 resources and services that would meet the needs of adults 37 currently in their care and of their families, and advocate for 38 39 the same without threat of reprisal; and 40



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that information concerning 1 behavioral problems, health history, educational status, 2 cultural and family background, and other issues relative to the 3 adult which are known to DOH at the time the adult is placed in 4 foster care should be made available to all ARCH operators; and 5 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DOH should have a staff person representing the department on call 24-hours a day, seven days a 8 week, for the purpose of aiding the ARCH operator in receiving 9 departmental assistance; and 10 11

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED ARCH operators should be provided the right to copies of all information relative to their family and services which DOH has collected and is contained in DOH ARCH records; and 16

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health,
and Director of Human Services.
