# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DIAMOND HEAD STATE MONUMENT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 184-3.4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§184-3.4 State parks special fund.** (a) There is  
4 established within the state treasury a fund to be known as the  
5 state parks special fund, into which shall be deposited:

6 (1) All proceeds collected by the state parks programs  
7 involving park user fees, any leases or concession  
8 agreements, the sale of any article purchased from the  
9 department to benefit the state parks programs, or any  
10 gifts or contributions; provided that proceeds derived  
11 from the operation of Iolani Palace shall be used to  
12 supplement its educational and interpretive programs;  
13 and

14 (2) Transient accommodations tax revenues pursuant to  
15 section 237D-6.5; provided that these moneys shall be  
16 expended in response to a master plan developed in  
17 coordination with the Hawaii tourism authority.



1 (b) The department shall expend the moneys from the state  
2 parks special fund for the following purposes:

- 3 (1) Permanent and temporary staff positions;
- 4 (2) Planning and development of state parks programs,  
5 including the aina hoomalu state parks program;
- 6 (3) Construction, repairs, replacement, additions, and  
7 extensions of state parks facilities;
- 8 (4) Operation and maintenance costs of state parks and  
9 state parks programs; and
- 10 (5) Administrative costs of the division of state parks.

11 (c) There is established within the state parks special  
12 fund, a Diamond Head State Monument sub-account, into which  
13 shall be deposited eighty per cent of all proceeds collected  
14 from the admission fees charged at the Diamond Head State  
15 Monument. The department shall expend the moneys from the  
16 Diamond Head State Monument sub-account for repair, maintenance,  
17 and operating costs incurred by the State in the management of  
18 the Diamond Head State Monument."

19 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.



**Report Title:**

Diamond Head State Monument

**Description:**

Establishes a sub-account under the state parks special fund into which eighty percent of the proceeds collected from the admission fees charged at the Diamond Head State Monument will be deposited and used to cover the costs of repair, maintenance, and operations at the Diamond Head State Monument. (SB138 HD1)
