A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTRACTOR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY OR DISASTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 444-10.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]§444-10.6[+] State of emergency or disaster; [acting
4	as a contractor without a license; penalty.] emergency
5	licensure; penalties. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision
6	of law to the contrary, the board may issue emergency
7	contractor's licenses during a state of emergency or disaster
8	duly declared by the governor under chapter 209.
9	(b) To qualify for an emergency contractor's license, an
10	applicant shall:
11	(1) Provide proof of licensure as a contractor in another
12	state with similar contractor licensing requirements
13	as those in this State, and that the license is
14	current and has been in good standing for the past two
15	years;
16	(2) Provide proof of liability and property damage
17	insurance, as specified in the board's rules;

1	(3)	Submit a current financial statement and applicable
2		credit reports as specified in the board's rules;
3	(4)	Pay all applicable application and license fees,
4		including recovery fund and education fund fees; and
5	(5)	Provide proof of intent to pay any and all applicable
6		state general excise taxes.
7	(c)	The classifications of emergency contractor's licenses
8	issued and	the duration of the emergency contractor's licenses
9	shall be o	determined by the board based on the nature and
10	duration o	of the state of emergency or disaster, and the needs
11	and best i	interests of the public.
12	(d)	The board may delegate the issuance of emergency
13	contractor	r's licenses to its administrative staff; provided that
14	the applic	cant shall be required to meet all of the requirements
15	specified	in this section before the issuance of the license.
16	<u>(e)</u>	Any person who violates section 444-9, in connection
17	with the o	offer or performance of repairs to a residential or
18	nonresider	ntial structure for damage caused by a natural disaster
19	in a polit	cical subdivision for which a state of emergency or
20	disaster i	is proclaimed by the governor, may be punished by a
21	fine of up	to \$10,000, or imprisonment up to one year, or both,
22	in additio	on to all other remedies or penalties."
