A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that violence, whether 2 against humans or animals, must not be tolerated in our 3 community. The legislature further finds that evidence suggests 4 that there is a link between animal abuse and the commission of 5 violent acts against humans, including domestic violence, child 6 abuse, and elder abuse. Mahatma Gandhi once said, "the 7 greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by 8 the way animals are treated." To properly address the growing 9 problem of violence in our society, we must first examine our 10 attitudes regarding the mistreatment of animals. By ridding our 11 community of animal abuse we will not only provide a safe 12 environment for pet animals, but also help to eliminate acts of 13 violence against people. The legislature believes that, by 14 establishing that our community will not tolerate those who 15 commit acts of violence against animals, Hawaii will become a 16 safer and more secure place for animals and humans alike. 17 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen Hawaii's animal

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 8 Any person subject to penalty under this section shall pay for
- 9 counseling unless the court determines that the person is unable

- 11 §711-B Cruelty to animals in the first degree. (1) A
- 12 person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in the first
- 13 degree if the person intentionally or knowingly tortures or
- 14 mutilates, or causes the torture or mutilation of any pet
- 15 animal.
- 16 (2) Cruelty to animals in the first degree is a class C
- 17 felony.
- 18 (3) A person convicted of committing the offense of
- 19 cruelty to animals in the first degree shall be subject to
- 20 section 711-A."

1 SECTION 3. Section 161-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending the definition of "poultry" to read as 3 follows: ""Poultry" means [any domesticated bird, whether live or 4 5 dead.] any domesticated bird belonging to the orders galliformes 6 and anseriformes, and including chicken, duck, goose, and 7 turkey." 8 SECTION 4. Section 711-1100, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 9 10 "\$711-1100 Definitions. In this chapter, unless a 11 different meaning is plainly required, or the definition is 12 otherwise limited by this section: 13 "Animal" includes every living creature, except a human 14 being. 15 ["Cruelty", "torture" or "torment" includes every act, 16 omission, or neglect whereby unjustifiable physical pain, 17 suffering, or death is caused or permitted.] 18 "Facsimile" means a document produced by a receiver of 19 signals transmitted over telecommunication lines, after 20 translating the signals, to produce a duplicate of an original

- 1 consumption. Poultry as defined by section 161-3 shall not be
- 2 considered a pet animal. Game fish and other aquatic life not
- 3 in a state of captivity shall not be considered pet animals.
- 4 "Private place" means a place where one may reasonably
- 5 expect to be safe from casual or hostile intrusion or
- 6 surveillance, but does not include a place to which the public
- 7 or a substantial group thereof has access.
- 8 "Public" means affecting or likely to affect a substantial
- 9 number of persons.
- "Public place" means a place to which the public or a
- 11 substantial group of persons has access and includes highways,
- 12 transportation facilities, schools, places of amusement or
- 13 business, parks, playgrounds, prisons, and hallways, lobbies,
- 14 and other portions of apartment houses and hotels not
- 15 constituting rooms or apartments designed for actual residence.

- 17 1111, means to videotape, film, photograph, or archive
- 18 electronically or digitally.
