## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 453-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Except as otherwise provided by law, no person shall
4	practice medicine or surgery in the [State] state, either
5	gratuitously or for pay, or $[\frac{\text{shall}}{\text{shall}}]$ offer to $[\frac{\text{so}}{\text{so}}]$ practice $[\tau]$
6	medicine or surgery in the state, or [shall] advertise or
7	announce one's self, either publicly or privately, as prepared
8	or qualified to $[rac{1}{100}]$ practice $[rac{1}{100}]$ medicine or surgery in the
9	state, or [shall] append the letters "Dr." or "M.D." to one's
10	$name[_{ au}]$ with the intent $[\frac{thereby}{}]$ to imply that the $[\frac{individual}{}]$
11	person is a practitioner of medicine or surgery, without having
12	a valid unrevoked license or a limited and temporary license $[ au]$
13	obtained from the board of medical examiners[, in form and
14	manner substantially as hereinafter set forth].
15	(b) Nothing herein shall:
16	(1) Apply to so-called Christian Scientists [ <del>so long as</del>

they merely]; provided that the Christian Scientists

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1		practice the religious tenets of their church without
2		pretending a knowledge of medicine or surgery;
3	(2)	Prohibit service in the case of emergency or the
4		domestic administration of family remedies;
5	(3)	Apply to any commissioned medical officer in the
6		United States armed forces or public health service
7		engaged in the discharge of one's official duty, nor
8		to any practitioner of medicine and surgery from
9		another state when in actual consultation, including
10		[but not limited to,] in-person, mail, electronic,
11		telephonic, fiber-optic, or other telemedicine
12		consultation with a licensed physician of this State,
13		if the physician from another state at the time of
14		such consultation is licensed to practice in the state
15		in which the physician resides; provided that:
16		(A) The physician from another state shall not open
17		an office, or appoint a place to meet patients $[\tau]$
18		in this State, or receive calls within the limits
19		of the State[+] for the provision of care for a
20		patient who is located in this State; [and]
21		(B) The licensed physician of this State retains
22		control and remains responsible for the provision

1		of care for the patient $[+]$ who is located in this
2		State; and
3		[provided further that the]
4		(C) The laws and regulations relating to contagious
5		diseases are not violated;
6	(4)	Prohibit services rendered by any person certified
7		under part II of this chapter to provide emergency
8		medical services, or any physician assistant, when the
9		services are rendered under the direction and control
10		of a physician licensed in this State except for final
11		refraction resulting in a prescription for spectacles,
12		contact lenses, or visual training as performed by an
13		oculist or optometrist duly licensed by the State.
14		The direction and control shall not be construed in
15		every case to require the personal presence of the
16		supervising and controlling physician. Any physician
17		who employs or directs a person certified under part
18		II of this chapter to provide emergency medical
19		services, or physician assistant, shall retain full
20		professional and personal responsibility for any act
21		which constitutes the practice of medicine when
22		performed by such person or physician assistant; [or]

1	(5)	Prohibit automatic external defibrillation by:
2		(A) Any first responder personnel certified by the
3		department of health to provide automatic
4		external defibrillation when it is rendered under
5		the medical oversight of a physician licensed in
6		this State; or
7		(B) Any person who successfully completes training
8		under an automatic external defibrillator program
9		administered by a physician. An "automatic
10		external defibrillator program" means an
11		appropriate training course that includes
12		cardiopulmonary resuscitation and proficiency in
13		the use of an automatic external
14		defibrillator[-];
15		<u>or</u>
16	(6)	Prohibit a radiologist duly licensed to practice
17		medicine and provide radiology services in another
18		state from using telemedicine while located in this
19		State to provide radiology services to a patient who
20		is located in the state in which the radiologist is
21		licensed. For the purposes of this paragraph:

1	"Radiologist" means a doctor of medicine or a
2	doctor of osteopathy certified in radiology by the
3	American Board of Radiology or the American Board of
4	Osteopathy.
5	"Telemedicine" means the use of
6	telecommunications services, as that term is defined
7	in section 269-1, including real-time video
8	conferencing-based communication, secure interactive
9	and non-interactive web-based communication, and
10	secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
11	patient medical information, such as diagnostic-
12	quality digital images and laboratory results for
13	medical interpretation and diagnosis, and deliver
14	health care services and information to parties
15	separated by distance."
16	SECTION 2. Section 466J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	"\$466J-6 Persons exempted. (a) Any provision in this
19	chapter to the contrary notwithstanding, a license shall not be
20	required for [ <del>licensed</del> ]:
21	(1) A licensed medical [practitioners] practitioner in
22	radiology[7];
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1	(2)	A licensed practitioner of nuclear medicine[, licensed
2		doctors];
3	<u>(3)</u>	A licensed doctor of dentistry[7];
4	(4)	A licensed dental [technicians, technician;
5	<u>(5)</u>	A licensed dental [hygienists, and students]
6		hygienist;
7	<u>(6)</u>	A student in an approved school for radiographers,
8		radiation therapists, or nuclear medicine
9		technologists, [and] or in [schools] a school of
10		medicine, podiatry, dentistry, or $\underline{a}$ chiropractic[ $ au$
11		when the persons are] school; provided that the
12		student is operating x-ray machines under the direct
13		supervision of a licensed radiographer, licensed
14		radiation therapist, licensed nuclear medicine
15		technologist, or a qualified person pursuant to this
16		chapter[-]; and
17	<u>(7)</u>	A radiologist duly licensed to practice medicine and
18		radiology services in another state who uses
19		telemedicine while located in this State to provide
20		radiology services to a patient who is located in the
21		state in which the radiologist is licensed. For the
22		purposes of this paragraph:

1		"Radiologist" means a doctor of medicine or a
2		doctor of osteopathy certified in radiology by the
3		American Board of Radiology or the American Board of
4		Osteopathy.
5		"Telemedicine" means the use of
6		telecommunications services, as that term is defined
7		in section 269-1, including real-time video
8		conferencing-based communication, secure interactive

16	(b)	The board may issue special temporary permits upon
17	request t	o unlicensed radiographers working in shortage areas.
18	[After Fe	bruary 10, 1995, new special temporary permits shall
19	not be is	sued by the board. After June 30, 1998, special
20	temporary	permits issued before February 10, 1995, shall not be
21	renewed.]	n

- 1 SECTION 3. Nothing herein shall be deemed to permit a
- 2 radiologist without a license to practice medicine in Hawaii,
- 3 wherever located, to provide services to a patient who is
- 4 located in Hawaii.
- 5 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

## Report Title:

Telemedicine; Radiology

## Description:

Permits a radiologist licensed to practice in another state to provide radiology services by telemedicine while in Hawaii to a patient who is located in the state in which the radiologist is licensed to practice radiology. (SB1674 HD2)
