# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 453-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 3 Except as otherwise provided by law, no person shall practice medicine or surgery in the State, either gratuitously 4 5 or for pay, or [shall] offer to [so] practice[7] medicine or 6 surgery in the State, or [shall] advertise or announce one's 7 self, either publicly or privately, as prepared or qualified to 8 [so] practice medicine or surgery in the State, or [shall] append the letters "Dr." or "M.D." to one's name[7] with the 9 10 intent [thereby] to imply that the [individual] person is a practitioner of medicine or surgery, without having a valid 11 12 unrevoked license or a limited and temporary license  $[\tau]$  obtained 13 from the board of medical examiners [, in form and manner 14 substantially as hereinafter set forth].
- 15 (b) Nothing herein shall:
- 16 (1) Apply to so-called Christian Scientists [so long as
  17 they merely]; provided that the Christian Scientists

1		practice the religious tenets of their church without
2		pretending a knowledge of medicine or surgery;
3	(2)	Prohibit service in the case of emergency or the
4		domestic administration of family remedies;
5	(3)	Apply to any commissioned medical officer in the
6		United States armed forces or public health service
7		engaged in the discharge of one's official duty, nor
8		to any practitioner of medicine and surgery from
9		another state when in actual consultation, including
10		[but not limited to,] in-person, mail, electronic,
11		telephonic, fiber-optic, or other telemedicine
12		consultation with a licensed physician of this State,
13		if the physician from another state at the time of
14		such consultation is licensed to practice in the state
15		in which the physician resides; provided that:
16		(A) The physician from another state shall not open
17		an office, or appoint a place to meet patients $[ au]$
18		in this State, or receive calls within the limits
19		of the State[+] for the provision of care for a
20		patient who is located in this State; and

- (C) The laws and regulations relating to contagious diseases are not violated;
- Prohibit services rendered by any person certified under part II of this chapter to provide emergency medical services, or any physician assistant, when the services are rendered under the direction and control of a physician licensed in this State except for final refraction resulting in a prescription for spectacles, contact lenses, or visual training as performed by an oculist or optometrist duly licensed by the State. The direction and control shall not be construed in every case to require the personal presence of the supervising and controlling physician. Any physician who employs or directs a person certified under part II of this chapter to provide emergency medical services, or physician assistant, shall retain full professional and personal responsibility for any act which constitutes the practice of medicine when performed by such person or physician assistant; [ex]

1	(5)	Prohibit automatic external defibrillation by:
2		(A) Any first responder personnel certified by the

16		medicine in another state from utilizing telemedicine
17		while located in this State to provide radiology
18		services to a patient who is located in the state by
19		which the radiologist is duly licensed to practice
20		medicine. For purposes of this paragraph,
21		"telemedicine" means the use of telecommunications
22		services, as that term is defined in section 269-1,

1		including real-time video conferencing-based
2		communication, secure interactive and non-interactive
3		web-based communication, and secure asynchronous
4		information exchange, to transmit patient medical
5		information, such as diagnostic-quality digital images
6		and laboratory results for medical interpretation and
7		diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced
8		health care services and information to parties
9		separated by distance."
10	SECT	ION 2. Section 466J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to	o read as follows:

17		doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy certified
18		in radiology by the American Board of Radiology or the
19		American Board of Osteopathy.
20	(b)	The board may issue special temporary permits upon

request to unlicensed radiographers working in shortage areas.

[After February 10, 1995, new special temporary permits shall

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- 1 not be issued by the board. After June 30, 1998, special
- 2 temporary permits issued before February 10, 1995, shall not be
- 3 renewed.]
- 4 (c) As used in this section, "telemedicine" means the use
- 5 of telecommunications services, as that term is defined in
- 6 section 269-1, including real-time video conferencing-based
- 7 communication, secure interactive and non-interactive web-based
- 8 communication, and secure asynchronous information exchange, to
- 9 transmit patient medical information, such as diagnostic-quality
- 10 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation
- 11 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health
- 12 care services and information to parties separated by distance."
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
