## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the homeless and
3	affordable housing crises continue to be two of the State's most
4	significant and challenging social problems.
5	The most recent estimate of the total number of homeless
6	persons in the State is six thousand twenty-nine on any given
7	day. In addition, the Hawaii Homeless Point-in-Time Study of
8	2003 found that over four thousand of these homeless persons are
9	unsheltered. This is indicative of the limited shelter space
10	available in the State.
11	Also troubling is the fact that a staggering thirty-seven
12	per cent of the unsheltered homeless are individuals of Hawaiian
13	or part-Hawaiian ancestry. Equally troubling is the fact that
14	on any given day, there are eight hundred thirty-eight homeless
15	children in the State. None of these numbers reflect the number
16	of people who are considered hidden homeless or those who are
17	at-risk of homelessness.

- 1 Housing, in general, is a critical issue for many residents 2 in Hawaii, where the cost of homeownership and rentals are increasing. The prospect of making high mortgage payments and 3 4 saving enough money for the downpayment and closing costs needed 5 to buy a home at current market prices is a formidable challenge. Even higher income families must often seek help 6 7 from relatives to overcome this obstacle. More needs to be done to increase the inventory of, and ensure that residents have 8 9 access to, affordable housing, as well. 10 The legislature recognizes that meaningful solutions to Hawaii's housing and homeless problems must be found. 11 The purpose of this Act is to: 12 13 (1) Provide funding for various homeless shelters and 14 transitional housing programs and services; Require the Hawaii housing finance and development 15 (2) corporation to create an affordable housing inventory 16 17 registry; 18 (3) Extend the sunset date for the allocation of a 19 percentage of conveyance tax revenues to the rental housing trust fund to June 30, 2012; and 20 21 (4) Provide funding for various affordable and public
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housing programs.

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1	PART II. THE HOMELESS
2	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
3	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so
4	much thereof as may be necessary for the fiscal year 2007-2008,
5	for homeless facilities, emergency shelters, and transitional
6	shelters, as defined by section 356D-121, Hawaii Revised
7	Statutes.
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
9	housing authority for the purposes of this section.
10	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so
12	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
13	the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
14	year 2008-2009, to provider agencies, as defined by section
15	356D-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, who offer outreach or support
16	services, or both, to unsheltered homeless, at risk homeless,
17	and those residing in homeless facilities, including emergency
18	shelters and transitional shelters.
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
20	of human services for the purposes of this section.
21	PART III. AFFORDABLE AND PUBLIC HOUSING

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 201H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] §201H-6[+] Housing advocacy and information system.
- 4 (a) The corporation, with the assistance of other agencies of
- 5 the State and counties with related responsibilities, shall
- 6 develop and maintain a housing advocacy and information system
- 7 to aid the corporation in meeting the needs and demands of
- 8 housing consumers.
- 9 (b) In establishing and maintaining the housing advocacy
- 10 and information system, the corporation shall conduct market
- 11 studies, engage in community outreach, and solicit
- 12 recommendations from, and statistics and research developed by,
- 13 agencies of the United States, the State, the counties, private
- 14 research organizations, nonprofit community groups, trade
- 15 associations, including those of the construction and real
- 16 estate industries, departments, individuals at the University of
- 17 Hawaii, and housing consumers.
- (c) The corporation shall analyze the information received
- 19 and make recommendations to the appropriate agencies and
- 20 developers.
- 21 (d) The corporation, through the housing advocacy and
- 22 information system, shall act as a clearinghouse for information

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1	relating	to housing conditions, needs, supply, demand,			
2	characteristics, developments, trends in federal housing				
3	programs,	and housing laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.			
4	(e)	The housing advocacy and information system may be			
5	used by h	ousing researchers, planners, administrators, and			
6	developer	s and shall be coordinated with other housing research			
7	efforts.	The corporation shall maintain a current supply of			
8	informati	on, including means to gather new information through			
9	surveys,	contracted research, and investigations.			
10	<u>(f)</u>	The corporation, through the housing advocacy and			
11	information system, shall develop and maintain an affordable				
12	housing inventory registry to identify:				
13	(1)	Affordable housing projects developed by the			
14		corporation utilizing moneys in the rental housing			
15		trust fund or the dwelling unit revolving fund;			
16	(2)	State and federal public housing projects identified			
17		by the Hawaii public housing authority;			
18	(3)	United States Department of Housing and Urban			
19		Development Region 9 federally supported and privately			
20		managed housing projects; and			

(4) State and county lands that may be developed for

affordable housing, as defined in section 201H-57(b)."

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SECTION 5. Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is
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    amended by amending section 30 to read as follows:
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         "SECTION 30. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006;
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    provided that on June 30, [2007,] 2012, section 21 shall be
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    repealed and section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
    reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the
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    approval of this Act."
         SECTION 6. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "§247-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected each
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    fiscal year under this chapter shall be paid into the state
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    treasury to the credit of the general fund of the State, to be
    used and expended for the purposes for which the general fund
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    was created and exists by law; provided that of the taxes
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    collected each fiscal year:

17	SECTION 7.	There is appropriated out of the general	
18	revenues of the	State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so	
19	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and		
20	the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
21	year 2008-2009, to be deposited in the rental housing trust		
22	fund.		

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         SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the rental housing
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    trust fund the sum of $
                                   , or so much thereof as may be
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    necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so
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    much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for
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    the planning, development, and construction of affordable
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    housing in cooperation with private and nonprofit developers.
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         The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
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    housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
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    this section.
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         SECTION 9. The director of finance is authorized to issue
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    general obligation bonds in the sum of $ , or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary, the proceeds of which are
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    appropriated for fiscal year 2007-2008, to be deposited in the
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    dwelling unit revolving fund.
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         SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the dwelling unit
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    revolving fund the sum of $ , or so much thereof as may
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    be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so
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    much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for
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    the planning, development, and construction of four thousand
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    affordable housing units in cooperation with private developers.
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- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 2 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
- 3 this section.
- 4 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
- 7 the repair and maintenance of existing federal and state public
- 8 housing buildings.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 10 housing authority for the purpose of this section.
- 11 SECTION 12. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 12 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ , or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary, the proceeds of which are
- 15 appropriated for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the purpose of
- 16 capital improvement projects.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 18 housing authority for the purpose of this section.
- 19 SECTION 13. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 20 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ , or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary, the proceeds of which are

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- 1 appropriated for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the repair and
- 2 maintenance of elevators in existing federal and state public
- 3 housing buildings.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 5 public housing authority for the purposes of this section.
- 6 PART IV.
- 7 SECTION 14. The appropriations made in sections 9, 12, and
- 8 13 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal biennium
- 9 for which the appropriation is made; provided that all
- 10 appropriations that are unencumbered as of June 30, 2010, shall
- 11 lapse as of that date.
- 12 SECTION 15. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007;
- 15 provided that section 5 of this Act shall take effect on
- 16 June 29, 2007.

Housing Omnibus Bill

## Description:

Extends the sunset date for the allocation of conveyance tax revenues to the rental housing trust fund and changes the allocation to an unspecified percentage; requires the Hawaii finance and development corporation to create an affordable housing inventory registry; and appropriates funds for various homeless and housing programs and projects.
