## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established an educational
2	workforce	working group that shall convene no later than
3	August 1,	2007, to examine and address the following issues:
4	(1)	How well the workforce needs of Hawaii are currently
5		being met;
6	(2)	How prepared the State is to meet the workforce needs
7		of the future;
8	(3)	What recommendations can be made to improve Hawaii's
9		educational system to fulfill the workforce needs of
10		the future;
11	(4)	What is the current relationship between public
12		schools and emerging industries;
13	(5)	What percentage of high school students participate in
14		any form of vocational or professional training
15		outside of the school setting;

- 1 (6) What aspects of high school curriculum, standards, and
  2 assessment strategies have a direct relationship to
  3 the state's future workforce needs;
  - (7) What are the challenges or impediments to creating a more direct relationship between schools and economy driving industries of the state;
    - (8) How might autonomous schools-within-schools, magnet schools, specialized schools, and charter schools be better used to create more direct links between high schools and economy driving industries of the state; and
- 12 (9) How might the size of public schools, the distribution
  13 of discretionary funding, the decentralized authority
  14 of school community councils or charter school local
  15 school boards, and other organizational reforms be
  16 better used to satisfy the workforce development needs
  17 of the information and technology age.
  - (b) The educational workforce working group shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations regarding the issues set forth in subsection (a), including any recommendations and proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2008.

5	(2)	Two representatives from the University of Hawaii						
6		system, including its community colleges; provided						
7		that at least one represents a neighbor island campus;						
8	(3)	The chairperson of the board of education or the						
9		chairperson's designee;						
10	(4)	The superintendent of education, or the						
11		superintendent's designee;						
12	(5)	Two high school principals appointed by the						
13		superintendent of education; provided that at least						
14		one is a neighbor island high school principal;						
15	(6)	A representative from the workforce development						
16		council;						
17	(7)	A representative from Enterprise Honolulu;						
18	(8)	A representative from the Aloha United Way;						
19	(9)	A representative from Hawaii Science and Technology						
20		Council; and						
21	(10)	A representative from the Honolulu Community Action						
22		Program.						

- 1 (d) The director of business, economic development, and
- 2 tourism or the director's designee shall convene the first
- 3 meeting of the education workforce working group, at which time
- 4 the members shall select a chair.
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000, or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the
- 8 educational workforce working group.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 11 section 1 of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. The department of education shall include
- 13 within its strategic plan, plans to ensure optimal use of
- 14 technology for administration, data collection, and data sharing
- 15 related to educational and workforce needs, and plans to ensure
- 16 personalized student education plans will provide a direct link
- 17 to economic and workforce needs.
- 18 The department of education shall submit a report
- 19 containing its five-year plan to the legislature no later than
- 20 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 21 2008.

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1	SECTION 4	. The	University	of	Hawaii	shall	prepare	a	report
2	detailing:								

- (1) The current activities on each of its campuses to prepare students with the skills and knowledge needed to successfully enter and progress in the Hawaii workforce;
- 7 (2) The University of Hawaii's current plans to increase the percentage of Hawaii high school graduates who 8 9 continue their education by enrolling in a University 10 of Hawaii campus and to increase the percentage of students who earn degrees or certificates within one 11 12 hundred fifty per cent of the planned length of the 13 degree, particularly in fields where the State is experiencing shortages of qualified employees; and 14
  - (3) Recommendations about additional steps the State needs to consider implementing to increase the number of qualified workers in the state.
- The University of Hawaii shall submit a report on the foregoing to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2008.
- 21 SECTION 5. (a) There is appropriated out of the general 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so

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- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 2 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 3 year 2008-2009, for 2.0 (FTE) workforce development liaison
- 4 positions and 1.0 (FTE) support staff position within the
- 5 department of education to assist the department of education in
- 6 coordinating workforce development efforts with the various
- 7 departments, agencies, businesses, and organizations, including
- 8 the University of Hawaii and public school academies, within the
- 9 state to provide students with:
- 10 (1) Career exploration, awareness, and mentoring;
- 11 (2) Access to unpaid and paid internships and experiential
- 12 learning opportunities; and
- 13 (3) Job placement assistance;
- 14 provided that the duties of the workforce development liaisons
- 15 shall be divided into public sector and private sector
- 16 relationships. The public sector liaison shall be responsible
- 17 for coordinating workforce development efforts between the
- 18 department of education and any department or agency of the
- 19 State, the counties, or any political subdivisions thereof, and
- 20 the private sector liaison shall be responsible for coordinating
- 21 workforce development efforts between the department of

1 education and businesses, non-profit organizations, and other 2 private sector organizations. 3 The workforce development liaisons shall also be responsible for: 4 Identifying future workforce need areas, such as 5 (1)nursing, teaching, science and technology, and 6 7 agribusiness; Working to establish new academies to support growth 8 (2) in workforce need areas; 9 10 Interfacing with the business community to determine (3) what skill sets are necessary and to create mutually 11 12 beneficial relationships between the schools or academies and businesses, including the development of 13 14 paid internships and facilitating job opportunities; 15 and

## Report Title:

Education; Workforce Development

## Description:

Establishes and appropriates funds for an educational workforce working group under DBEDT, to examine and address issues workforce and workforce-related education issues. Requires DOE to include in its strategic plan, plans for workforce-related needs. Requires UH to submit a report to the Legislature on its workforce development efforts.
