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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WEST MAUI TRANSPORTATION ACCESS PLAN.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that West Maui is one of  
2 the largest generators of state and county revenues and is one  
3 of the largest visitor destinations outside of Waikiki. Yet  
4 access into and out of the region is served by only one major  
5 highway that may be closed for days at a moment's notice, which  
6 occurred in the past two years due to wildfires. In West Maui,  
7 unlike in other areas where a full-blown natural disaster is the  
8 cause for a total shutdown of transportation access, events and  
9 accidents that do not rise to the level of an emergency have  
10 closed the highway for days. Because of the non-emergency  
11 status of these incidents, the State has no coordinated plan to  
12 transport people into and out of West Maui during road closures.  
13 Because there is no hospital in West Maui, such road closures  
14 put people's lives at risk. They also divide families, as many  
15 Maui residents work in West Maui but reside in other parts of  
16 Maui county. The booming visitor industry in West Maui is also  
17 jeopardized.



1           During July of 2007, when a fire closed the highway for  
2 several days, a task force was created by the department of land  
3 and natural resources to address transportation access to West  
4 Maui. However, because no official support was mandated for  
5 this group's work, the task force has dispersed. The  
6 legislature finds that a West Maui transportation access plan is  
7 critical.

8           The purpose of this Act is to require the Maui civil  
9 defense agency to develop a West Maui transportation access  
10 plan, which can serve as a model for developing plans in other  
11 areas with similar problems, such as West Kauai, Wainee, and the  
12 Kealahou area.

13           SECTION 2. (a) The Maui civil defense agency shall create  
14 an informal, temporary West Maui transportation access plan  
15 working group within the agency to develop a West Maui  
16 transportation access plan to address road closures in West  
17 Maui. The working group may elect a chairperson from among its  
18 members. The working group shall consist of the following  
19 members:

- 20           (1) The administrator of the Maui civil defense agency;  
21           (2) The state senator representing district 5;  
22           (3) The state representative representing district 10;



- 1       (4)   The member of the Maui county council representing
- 2           West Maui;
- 3       (5)   The director of transportation;
- 4       (6)   The chief of the highways division of the department
- 5           of transportation;
- 6       (7)   The mayor of Maui county;
- 7       (8)   The director of the department of transportation of
- 8           Maui county;
- 9       (9)   The police chief of Maui county;
- 10      (10)  The fire chief of Maui county;
- 11      (11)  A staff member of the department of land and natural
- 12           resources representing the Lahaina small boat harbor;
- 13      (12)  A representative of Lahaina Bypass Now;
- 14      (13)  A representative of the Kaanapali Beach Resort
- 15           Association;
- 16      (14)  A representative of the Maui Visitors Bureau;
- 17      (15)  A Maui-based representative of Island Air;
- 18      (16)  A Maui-based representative of the Car and Truck
- 19           Renting and Leasing Association;
- 20      (17)  A representative of the Maui Hotel and Lodging
- 21           Association;



- 1 (18) A Maui-based representative of the Hawaii  
2 Transportation Association;
- 3 (19) A representative of the Pacific Radio Group;
- 4 (20) A representative of Expeditions Lanai Ferry;
- 5 (21) A representative of Molokai Princess Ferry; and
- 6 (22) A Maui-based representative of Cruise Lines  
7 International Association.

8 (b) The temporary working group shall develop a West Maui  
9 transportation access plan to address road closures in West Maui  
10 and may contract with a consultant to develop the plan without  
11 regard to chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

12 (c) The temporary working group shall submit a written  
13 report including findings, recommendations, the finalized West  
14 Maui transportation access plan, and any necessary proposed  
15 legislation to the legislature no later than twenty days prior  
16 to the convening of the regular session of 2009.

17 (d) The temporary working group shall cease to exist on  
18 June 30, 2009.

19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general  
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much  
21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the  
22 West Maui transportation access plan working group to develop a



1 West Maui transportation access plan, including the hiring of a  
2 technical consultant.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of  
4 Maui for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,  
6 except that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.



**Report Title:**

West Maui Transportation Access Plan; Appropriation

**Description:**

Creates an informal, temporary West Maui transportation access plan working group to develop a West Maui transportation access plan. Allows hiring of a consultant without regard to the Hawaii procurement code to develop the plan. Appropriates funds. (SB2156 HD1)
