Section 707-767, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: 10 "(1) A person commits the offense of extortion in the 11 third degree if the person commits extortion of property, labor, 12 or services." SECTION 8. Section 712-1202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 15 "\$712-1202 Promoting prostitution in the first degree. (1) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in 16 17 the first degree if the person knowingly: 18 Advances prostitution by compelling a person by (a) [criminal coercion] force, threat, or intimidation to 19 engage in prostitution, or profits from such coercive 20

conduct by another; or
