A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that 200,000 accidental
- 2 deaths occur each year in hospitals in the United States.
- 3 According to The Honolulu Advertiser, March 3, 2007, Hawaii
- 4 hospitals ranked in the bottom 20 per cent when compared to
- 5 other states in an analysis that included risk-adjusted
- 6 mortality, patient safety, and risk-adjusted complications.
- 7 Hawaii is experiencing an extreme shortage of professional
- 8 health care workers, particularly nurses. Patient safety is
- 9 often linked to nursing care. The medical-surgical units and
- 10 nursing stations of a typical acute-care hospital are where most
- 11 patients receive non-critical care, generally involving
- 12 regularly scheduled nursing rounds every four to five hours.
- 13 Nevertheless, acute or unexpected clinical events can go
- 14 unnoticed for critical minutes or hours, until the next visit by
- 15 a physician or nurse. The lack of more frequent observation may
- 16 result in adverse patient outcomes, higher health care costs,
- 17 and possible medical malpractice claims.

- 3 SECTION 4. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:

- 8 after January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations

- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
