A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 431M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 4 and to read:
- 5 ""Marriage and family therapist" means a person licensed in
- 6 marriage and family therapy practice pursuant to chapter 451J."
- 7 2. By amending the definitions of "alcohol or drug
- 8 dependence outpatient services" and "day treatment services" to
- 9 read:
- ""Alcohol or drug dependence outpatient services" means
- 11 alcohol or drug dependence nonresidential treatment provided on
- 12 an ambulatory basis to patients with alcohol or drug dependence
- 13 problems that includes interventions prescribed and performed by
- 14 qualified physicians, psychologists, licensed clinical social
- 15 workers, marriage and family therapists, or advanced practice
- 16 registered nurses. This definition shall not imply a broadening

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    of the scope of or granting of prescriptive authority
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    privileges, except as otherwise allowed pursuant to chapter 457.
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         "Day treatment services" means treatment services provided
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    by a hospital, mental health outpatient facility, or nonhospital
    facility to patients who, because of their conditions, require

    more than periodic hourly service. Day treatment services shall
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    be prescribed by a physician, psychologist, licensed clinical
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    social worker, marriage and family therapist, or advanced
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    practice registered nurse, and carried out under the supervision
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    of a physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker,
    marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice registered
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    nurse. Day treatment services require less than twenty-four
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    hours of care and a minimum of three hours in any one day."
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         3. By amending the definition of "mental health outpatient
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    services" to read:
         ""Mental health outpatient services" means mental health
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    nonresidential treatment provided on an ambulatory basis to
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    patients with mental illness that includes interventions
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    prescribed and performed by a physician, psychologist, licensed
    clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, or
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    advanced practice registered nurse."
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4. By amending the definition of "partial hospitalization
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    services" to read:
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         ""Partial hospitalization services" means treatment
    services, including in-hospital treatment services or benefits,
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    provided by a hospital or mental health outpatient facility to
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    patients who, because of their conditions, require more than
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    periodic hourly service. Partial hospitalization services shall
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    be prescribed by a physician or psychologist, and may be
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    prescribed by a licensed clinical social worker, marriage and
    family therapist, or advanced practice registered nurse in
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    consultation with a physician or psychologist [or an advanced
    practice registered nurse in consultation with a physician or
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    psychologist]. Partial hospitalization services require less
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    than twenty-four hours of care and a minimum of three hours in

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         5. By amending the definition of "qualified" to read:
         ""Oualified" means:
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              Having skill in the diagnosis or treatment of
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         (1)
              substance use disorders, based on a practitioner's
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              credentials, including but not limited to professional
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              education, clinical training, licensure, board or
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              other certification, clinical experience, letters of
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1	reference, other professional qualifications, and
2	disciplinary action; or
3	(2) Being a licensed physician, psychologist, licensed
4	clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist,
5	or advanced practice registered nurse, and certified
6	pursuant to chapter 321."
7	6. By amending the definition of "treatment episode" to
8	read:
9	""Treatment episode" means one admission to an accredited
10	hospital or nonhospital facility, or office of a qualified
11	physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker,
12	marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice registered
13	nurse for treatment of alcohol or drug dependence, or both, as
14	stipulated in a prescribed treatment plan and that would
15	generally produce remission in those who complete the treatment.
16	The prescribed treatment plan may include the provision of
17	substance abuse services in more than one location and may
18	include in-hospital, nonhospital residential, day treatment, or
19	alcohol or drug dependence outpatient services, or any
20	combination thereof. An admission for only detoxification
21	services shall not constitute a treatment episode."

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 431M-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Covered benefits for alcohol dependence, drug dependence, or mental illness insurance policies, hospital or 4 medical service plan contracts, and health maintenance 5 6 organization health plan contracts shall be limited to those 7 services certified by the insurance or health care plan 8 carrier's physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social 9 worker, marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice 10 registered nurse as medically or psychologically necessary at the least restrictive appropriate level of care." 11 12 SECTION 3. Section 431M-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 "§431M-4 Mental illness, alcohol and drug dependence 15 benefits. (a) The covered benefit under this chapter shall not be less than thirty days of in-hospital services per year. Each 16 17 day of in-hospital services may be exchanged for two days of 18 nonhospital residential services, two days of partial 19 hospitalization services, or two days of day treatment services. Visits to a physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social 20 worker, marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice 21 22 registered nurse shall not be less than thirty visits per year
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- 1 to hospital or nonhospital facilities or to mental health
- 2 outpatient facilities for day treatment or partial
- 3 hospitalization services. Each day of in-hospital services may
- 4 also be exchanged for two outpatient visits under this chapter;
- 5 provided that the patient's condition is such that the
- 6 outpatient services would reasonably preclude hospitalization.
- 7 The total covered benefit for outpatient services in subsections
- 8 (b) and (c) shall not be less than twenty-four visits per year;
- 9 provided that coverage of twelve of the twenty-four outpatient
- 10 visits shall apply only to the services under subsection (c).
- 11 The other covered benefits under this chapter shall apply to any
- 12 of the services in subsection (b) or (c). In the case of
- 13 alcohol and drug dependence benefits, the insurance policy may
- 14 limit the number of treatment episodes but may not limit the
- 15 number to less than two treatment episodes per lifetime.
- 16 Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit serious
- 17 mental illness benefits.
- (b) Alcohol and drug dependence benefits shall be as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (1) Detoxification services as a covered benefit under
- 21 this chapter shall be provided either in a hospital or
- in a nonhospital facility that has a written

T		attribution agreement with a nospital for emergency,
2		medical, and mental health support services. The
3		following services shall be covered under
4		detoxification services:
5		(A) Room and board;
6		(B) Diagnostic x-rays;
7		(C) Laboratory testing; and
8		(D) Drugs, equipment use, special therapies, and
9		supplies.
10		Detoxification services shall be included as part of
11		the covered in-hospital services, but shall not be
12		included in the treatment episode limitation, as
13		specified in subsection (a);
14	(2)	Alcohol or drug dependence treatment through
15		in-hospital, nonhospital residential, or day treatment
16		substance abuse services as a covered benefit under
17		this chapter shall be provided in a hospital or
18		nonhospital facility. Before a person qualifies to
19		receive benefits under this subsection, a qualified
20		physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social
21		worker, marriage and family therapist, or advanced
22		practice registered nurse shall determine that the

person suffers from alcohol or drug dependence, or both; provided that the substance abuse services covered under this paragraph shall include those services that are required for licensure and accreditation and shall be included as part of the covered in-hospital services as specified in subsection (a). Excluded from alcohol or drug dependence treatment under this subsection are detoxification services and educational programs to which drinking or drugged drivers are referred by the judicial system and services performed by mutual self-help groups;

(3) Alcohol or drug dependence outpatient services as a covered benefit under this chapter shall be provided under an individualized treatment plan approved by a qualified physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice registered nurse and shall be services reasonably expected to produce remission of the patient's condition. An individualized treatment plan approved by a marriage and family therapist, licensed clinical social worker, or an advanced

practice registered nurse for a patient already under the care or treatment of a physician or psychologist shall be done in consultation with the physician or psychologist. Services covered under this paragraph shall be included as part of the covered outpatient services as specified in subsection (a); and

- dependence as a covered benefit under this section for a child facing disciplinary action under section 302A-1134.6 shall be provided by a qualified physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, advanced practice registered nurse, or certified substance abuse counselor. The certified substance abuse counselor shall be employed by a hospital or nonhospital facility providing substance abuse services. The substance abuse assessment shall evaluate the suitability for substance abuse treatment and placement in an appropriate treatment setting.
- (c) Mental illness benefits.
- (1) Covered benefits for mental health services set forth in this subsection shall be limited to coverage for diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders. All

1		mental health services shall be provided under an
2		individualized treatment plan approved by a physician,
3 .		psychologist, licensed clinical social worker,
4		marriage and family therapist, or advanced practice
5		registered nurse and must be reasonably expected to
6		improve the patient's condition. An individualized
7		treatment plan approved by a licensed clinical social
8		worker, marriage and family therapist, or an advanced
9		practice registered nurse for a patient already under
10		the care or treatment of a physician or psychologist
11		shall be done in consultation with the physician or
12		psychologist;
13	(2)	In-hospital and nonhospital residential mental health
14		services as a covered benefit under this chapter shall
15		be provided in a hospital or a nonhospital residential
16		facility. The services to be covered shall include
17		those services required for licensure and
18	•	accreditation, and shall be included as part of the
19		covered in-hospital services as specified in
20		subsection (a);
21	(3)	Mental health partial hospitalization as a covered

benefit under this chapter shall be provided by a

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1	hospital or a mental health outpatient facility. The
2	services to be covered under this paragraph shall
3	include those services required for licensure and
4	accreditation and shall be included as part of the
5	covered in-hospital services as specified in
6	subsection (a); and
7	(4) Mental health outpatient services shall be a covered
8	benefit under this chapter and shall be included as
9	part of the covered outpatient services as specified
10	in subsection (a)."
11	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
