A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I				
2	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to increase the			
3	supply and enhance the quality of early childhood education				
4	opportunities for young children in the State by:				
5	(1)	Promoting developmentally-appropriate junior			
6		kindergarten and kindergarten programs with			
7		appropriate student-to-teacher ratios, standards,			
8		curricula, and assessments; and			
9	(2)	Supporting the preparation and professional			
10		development of early childhood educators and			
11		administrators; and			
12	(3)	Increasing the availability of facilities for early			
13		childhood education programs through the			
14		identification of unused public school facilities and			
15		a new pre-plus initiative.			
16		PART II			

- 1 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that according to a 2006
- 2 junior kindergarten pilot program evaluation report commissioned
- 3 by the Hawaii Educational Policy Center, additional funding and
- 4 support are needed to implement a flexible, developmentally-
- 5 appropriate junior kindergarten program for young children.
- 6 Specifically, the junior kindergarten program requires qualified
- 7 teaching professionals who will implement developmentally-
- 8 appropriate standards, curricula, and assessments, in a
- 9 classroom environment of one adult for every ten students.
- 10 The legislature further finds that public-private
- 11 partnerships provide opportunities to address the needs of both
- 12 junior kindergarten students as well as preschool-age students
- 13 with special needs, who would benefit from more opportunities
- 14 for inclusion. The legislature therefore encourages greater
- 15 collaboration between state-funded junior kindergarten and early
- 16 childhood special education programs, with private early
- 17 childhood education providers, to better meet the needs of our
- 18 young students.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 "§302A-411 Junior kindergarten and kindergarten program;
- 22 establishment; attendance. (a) The department shall establish



- 1 and maintain junior kindergartens and kindergartens with a
- 2 program of instruction as a part of the public school system;
- 3 provided that:
- 4 (1) Attendance shall not be mandatory; and
- 5 (2) Charter schools shall be excluded from mandatory
- 6 participation in the program.
- 7 (b) The department shall establish a two-tier junior
- 8 kindergarten and kindergarten program to support the range of
- 9 developmental abilities of children in junior kindergarten and
- 10 kindergarten. [Any] No school [may] shall move students between
- 11 junior kindergarten and kindergarten [as the school deems
- 12 appropriate. Junior kindergarten students may graduate directly
- 13 to grade one.] except in cases in which the movement is based on
- 14 appropriate assessments determined by:
- 15 (1) The professional judgment and experience of a
- 16 qualified teacher with early childhood education
- 17 background and experience; or
- 18 (2) The testing of a student's academic, physical, social,
- and emotional abilities;
- 20 provided that beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, the
- 21 department shall use assessment guidelines for determining a
- 22 student's placement and for deciding a student's movement.



1	<u>(C)</u>	The program shall include separate curricula for
2	junior ki	ndergarten and kindergarten students that are tailored
3	to the sp	ecific needs and abilities of students in each tier.
4	In develo	ping the curriculum for the junior kindergarten tier,
5	the depar	tment shall incorporate the Hawaii preschool content
6	standards	for four-year-old children and may review and consider
7	the use o	f established preschool curriculum.
8	<u>(d)</u>	The program shall include any or all of the following
9	models:	
10	(1)	Classrooms composed exclusively of either junior
11		kindergarten or kindergarten students;
12	(2)	Coordination with public, private, or public-private
13		entities to address the needs of junior [kindergarten-
14		eligible] kindergarten and preschool-age special
15		education students within the school's community[; and
16	(3)	The blending of junior kindergarten and kindergarten
17		students in a single classroom.]
18	[(c)] (e) Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, a
19	child who	will be at least five years of age on or before
20	December	31 of the school year may attend a public school
21	kindergar	ten. Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, a child
22	who will	be at least five years of age on or before August 1 of
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1	the school year may attend a public school kindergarten.					
2	Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at					
3	least five years of age after August 1 and before January 1 of					
4	the school year may attend a public school junior kindergarten.					
5	(f) The	department shall give preference to qualified				
6	individuals to	be placed in junior kindergarten and kindergarten				
7	programs begin	nning in the 2008-2009 school year, who have early				
8	childhood educ	cation credentials and experience as follows:				
9	<u>(1)</u> For	teachers:				
10	<u>(A)</u>	Early childhood education, program level PK-3 as				
11		licensed by the Hawaii teacher standards board;				
12	<u>(B)</u>	Elementary education, program level K-6 as				
13		licensed by the Hawaii teacher standards board,				
14		with additional coursework leading to a				
15		certificate in early childhood education; or				
16	(C)	Special education, program level K-12, as				
17		licensed by the Hawaii teacher standards board,				
18		with additional coursework leading to a				
19		certificate in early childhood education;				
20		and				
21	(2) For	junior kindergarten educational assistants:				

1		<u>(A)</u>	An associate's degree in early childhood			
2			education; or			
3		<u>(B)</u>	A child development associate certification.			
4	The depar	tment	shall ensure that school administrators of junior			
5	kindergar	ten a	nd kindergarten programs receive professional			
6	developme	nt in	best practices for effective leadership of all			
7	kindergarten programs.					
8	[-(d) -] <u>(g)</u>	The department may accept gifts to establish and			
9	maintain junior kindergartens and kindergartens."					
10	SECT	ION 4	. The department of education shall, no later			
11	than twen	ty da	ys prior to the convening of the regular session			
12	of 2008:					
13	(1)	Comp	lete the planning and development of the			
14		appr	opriate curriculum for the junior kindergarten			
15		prog	ram; and			
16	(2)	Subm	it its findings and recommendations to the			
17		legi	slature on the planned junior kindergarten			
18		curr	icula, successful models, and assessments to be			
19		used	in the placement and movement of students between			
20		juni	or kindergarten, kindergarten, and first grade, as			
21		well	as facilities to be used for junior kindergarten.			

1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the 4 same sum of so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 5 2008-2009 for junior kindergarten teachers to achieve a student-6 to-teacher ratio of ten students to one teacher in junior 7 kindergarten programs. 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 9 education for the purposes of this section. 10 PART III SECTION 6. An interim report of the early learning 11 12 educational task force, established by Act 259, Session Laws of 13 Hawaii 2006, recommended increasing early educator capacity 14 through improved access to education and training opportunities. 15 The legislature finds that early childhood teacher training and 16 professional development opportunities may be expanded by 17 providing educators with greater access to state-funded 18 financial aid and increasing the availability of distance 19 learning and relevant early childhood education college courses.

SECTION 7. Section 304A-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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amended to read as follows:

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- "[+]\$304A-701[+] Hawaii educator loans; eligibility; 1 2 amounts. There is created the Hawaii educator loan program to 3 be administered by the University of Hawaii, to provide 4 financial support to students who complete a state-approved 5 teacher education program and who agree to teach in the Hawaii 6 public school system[-]; provided that ten per cent of the sums 7 appropriated into the Hawaii educator loan program special fund 8 shall be used to assist educators seeking associate's or 9 bachelor's degrees in early childhood education. Eligibility 10 shall be awarded by the university to students on a competitive basis. The amount to be loaned to a student shall be determined 11 12 by the board of regents based on need for financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-approved teacher education 13 14 program at the university. The maximum amount of loans that a 15 student may receive under this program shall be an aggregate 16 amount equivalent to tuition payments and costs of textbooks and 17 other instructional materials necessary to complete a state-18 approved teacher education program."
- 19 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for fiscal
 21 year 2007-2008 to be deposited into the Hawaii educator loan
 22 program special fund to assist early childhood educators who are

- 1 seeking associate's or bachelor's degrees in early childhood
- 2 education.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 4 Hawaii for the purposes of this part.
- 5 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for
- 8 developmental courses for public school junior kindergarten and
- 9 kindergarten teachers that will result in a 12-credit
- 10 certificate in early childhood education.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii P-20
- 12 initiative of the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this
- 13 part.
- 14 PART IV
- 15 SECTION 10. The legislature recognizes that a 2002 public-
- 16 private initiative entitled "pre-plus" resulted in the
- 17 development of seventeen additional preschool classroom
- 18 facilities on public elementary school campuses. The department
- 19 of education, department of human services, and department of
- 20 accounting and general services collaborated with private early
- 21 childhood education providers to increase the availability of
- 22 early education opportunities for over three hundred and fifty,

- 1 four-year-old children with high needs. However, more support
- 2 is needed to increase the supply of suitable classrooms for
- 3 early childhood programs statewide.
- 4 SECTION 11. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 6 and to read as follows:
- 7 "§302A- Early childhood education facilities; pre-plus.
- 8 (a) The department, department of human services, and
- 9 department of accounting and general services shall work
- 10 collaboratively to develop suitable pre-plus classrooms on
- 11 department of education school campuses statewide, including
- 12 conversion charter school campuses, for early childhood
- 13 education programs serving preschool-age children between three
- 14 and five years of age.
- 15 (b) The department shall coordinate site selection, with
- 16 priority given to pubic school sites that serve students
- 17 predominantly of low socioeconomic status or with special needs
- 18 who require full-inclusion opportunities, or schools that are in
- 19 restructuring under the federal No Child Left Behind Act.
- 20 (c) The department of human services shall administer the
- 21 appropriated capital improvement project funds for the planning,
- 22 design, and construction of temporary facilities to support pre-



- 1 plus programs on designated public school campuses. The
- 2 department of human services shall collaborate with the
- 3 department on the eventual transfer of capital improvement
- 4 project administration.
- 5 (d) The department of accounting and general services
- 6 shall implement required planning, design, and construction
- 7 functions for temporary facilities to support pre-plus programs
- 8 on designated public school campuses, subject to adequate
- 9 department and department of human services guidance, direction,
- 10 and capital improvement project funding being approved. The
- 11 department of accounting and general services shall collaborate
- 12 with the department on the eventual transfer of planning,
- 13 design, and construction functions.
- 14 (e) The department shall procure preschool service
- 15 delivery and implementation and provide general oversight of the
- 16 pre-plus program. Programs shall meet quality early childhood
- 17 education standards, such as Head Start performance standards,
- 18 accreditation requirements of the National Association for the
- 19 Education of Young Children, or the requirements of other
- 20 appropriate accreditation bodies as determined by the
- 21 department."

- 1 SECTION 12. Section 302A-1506.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 2 is amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]§302A-1506.5[+] Early childhood education facilities;
- 4 identifying sites[+]; inspections. (a) The department of
- 5 education shall identify unused public school facilities for use
- 6 by early childhood education programs. Suitable empty
- 7 classrooms, as determined by the department, shall be
- 8 [inventoried for potential use in] prepared and utilized for
- 9 early childhood education programs [-]; provided that the
- 10 classrooms shall meet the licensing standards determined by the
- 11 departments of education and human services. [Priority shall be
- 12 given to facilities on sites with sufficient space for three or
- 13 more classrooms to be renovated or constructed.
- 14 (b) The department shall assist in the identification of
- 15 possible construction sites for private providers to build early
- 16 childhood education facilities.
- 17 (c) The department of human services, which currently
- 18 inspects early childhood education facilities for the proper
- 19 operation, sanitation, and safety of the facilities, shall
- 20 submit regular reports with its findings and recommendations to
- 21 the department of education. All early childhood education
- 22 facilities shall be open at all times to visitation and



- 1 inspection by representatives of the departments of education,
- 2 human services, and health, and by the designated
- 3 representatives of the respective county fire departments.
- 4 (d) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
- 5 to effectuate this section."
- 6 SECTION 13. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 7 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much thereof
- 8 as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof as may
- 9 be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the
- 10 plans, design, and construction of facilities as part of the
- 11 pre-plus initiative.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 14 SECTION 14. The appropriation made for the capital
- 15 improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
- 16 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
- 17 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
- 18 unencumbered as of June 30, 2010, shall lapse as of that date.
- 19 PART V
- 20 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for an

- 1 early childhood education specialist to focus on early childhood
- 2 education, kindergarten programs, and pre-plus program
- 3 administration; provided that the early childhood education
- 4 specialist shall report directly to the superintendent of
- 5 education.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 education for the purposes of this section.
- 8 PART VI
- 9 SECTION 16. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 17. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
