A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MUSEUM OF HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the economic 2 viability of Hawaii's tourism is heavily dependent upon the 3 Hawaiian culture. The culture of the indigenous people is 4 unique and of critical importance in differentiating Hawaii from 5 other visitor destinations. Tourism promotions, particularly 6 through media such as music and dance, have relied upon the 7 Hawaiian culture as the number one marketing tool and as the foundation for perpetuating the spirit of aloha that is vital to 8 9 the economic success of the industry. The National Academy of 10 Recording Arts and Sciences has recently added the new category 11 of best Hawaiian Music Album to the prestigious Grammy Awards, 12 thereby creating new audiences for Hawaiian music around the 13 world.

14 The legislature further finds that the history of Hawaiian 15 music and dance demonstrates a proud statement of cultural 16 identity. A compilation of collective works and related 17 memorabilia of exceptional individuals who are highly regarded

in their respective fields of endeavor will act to preserve and
 perpetuate the Hawaiian culture as well as to promote
 appreciation for these art forms for present and future
 generations.

5 The purpose of this Act is to establish a museum of
6 Hawaiian music and dance committee to determine the appropriate
7 type of institution that should be established, its location,
8 and possible financing mechanisms, and to complete an initial
9 business plan for the museum of Hawaiian music and dance.

SECTION 2. (a) There is established a museum of Hawaiian music and dance committee that shall consist of thirteen members and shall include:

- 13 (1) The executive director of the Hawaii tourism
- 14 authority, or the director's designated
- 15 representative; and
- 16 (2) A representative from each of the following:
- 17 (A) The state foundation on culture and the arts;
- 18 (B) The office of Hawaiian affairs;
- 19 (C) Kamehameha Schools;
- 20 (D) Bishop Museum; and
 - (E) The Hawaiian Music Hall of Fame.
