A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that economic growth that 2 benefits all Hawaii residents depends on enhancing the State's 3 human resources. 4 Providing students with the specific skills needed for job 5 entry and broad, transferable skills that help students to obtain employment in other fields is an integral part of 6 7 developing these human resources. 8 Career technical education that includes: 9 Pathway programs of study such as graphic design, (1)computer networking, and management information 10 11 systems; 12 (2) Academics for various focuses of study, including the 13 performing arts; health and human services; science, 14 technology, engineering, and math; and construction 15 academies; and

School activities such as project EAST (environmental

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- are important in assisting Hawaii's students in gaining the 1 2 necessary skills required to compete in the global economy. 3 The legislature further finds that with the decline of the 4 sugar and pineapple industries in Hawaii, agricultural lands are 5 evolving into small diversified agricultural farms. Further, 6 with the demand for landscaping by many public and private 7 businesses, the landscaping industry is purportedly as large as 8 the diversified agriculture industry in Hawaii. The legislature 9 further finds that the need for agricultural workers, including 10 landscaping and other agriculture industry-related workers, runs 11 the gamut in terms of skill level. There is a critical need for 12 government support to establish an educational infrastructure 13 that prepares students for work in the agriculture and 14 agriculture-related industries. Appropriate programs would 15 assist in preparing students, who are otherwise unlikely to 16 pursue higher education, for jobs that are in demand.
- 18 (1) Support and enhance the career and technical education
 19 efforts of both the department of education and
 20 University of Hawaii system, as well as other public
 21 and private business efforts, to prepare Hawaii's
 22 students for further education and employment; and

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The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(2) Broaden the agriculture education program of the
2	department of education to offer educational
3	opportunities in the fields of farming, diversified
4	agriculture, culinary arts, landscaping, and related
5	industries such as market development and science and
6	technology.
7	SECTION 2. Section 302A-431.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"[+]\$302A-431.7[] Vocational agriculture] Agriculture
10	education program. (a) The department shall establish and
11	administer a [vocational] comprehensive agriculture education
12	program. The <u>agriculture education</u> program shall include
13	adequate staffing of individuals trained or experienced in the
14	field of [vocational] agriculture to coordinate the program and
15	to provide assistance to school [districts] complexes for the
16	coordination of the activities of $\underline{\text{related}}$ student [$\underline{\text{agricultural}}$]
17	organizations and associations.
18	(b) The [vocational] agriculture education program shall
19	be administered by a director who shall:
20	(1) Assess the agricultural needs of the State and devise
21	methods of meeting those needs with the [vocational]

agriculture education program;

3	(3)	Review school district applications for approval of

15		administrators of [vocational] agriculture;
16	(8)	Review applications for [vocational] agriculture
17		teacher certification;
18	(9)	Assist in teacher recruitment and placement in
19		[vocational] agriculture programs;
20	(10)	Serve as a liaison with the Future Farmers of America,
21		representatives of business, industry, appropriate

1		public agencies, and institutions of higher education
2		to facilitate dissemination of information;
3	(11)	Promote improvement of [vocational] agriculture
4		programs;
5	(12)	Assist in the development of adult [and], continuing
6		education, and college-level education programs in
7		[vocational] agriculture; and
8	[(13)	Establish an advisory task force of agriculturists,
9		who represent the diverse areas of the agricultural
10		industry in the State, that shall make annual
11		recommendations on the development of curriculum,
12		staffing, and strategies to establish a source of
13		trained and qualified individuals in agriculture and
14		strategies for developing the state program in
15		vocational agriculture education, including youth
16		leadership throughout the public schools.
17	(13)	Assist in the administration of the agricultural and
18		culinary education program established in subsection
19		<u>(c).</u>
20	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall establish and administer an
21	agricultu	ral and culinary education program that integrates
22	culinary	arts with the school lunch program and the agriculture
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- 1 education program to teach students healthy eating habits and
- 2 encourage culinary arts, farming, diversified agriculture, and
- 3 related industries such as market development and science and
- 4 technology, as career options. The department of agriculture
- 5 shall assist the department with the implementation of this
- 6 program.
- 7 [(c)] (d) The department may adopt rules pursuant to
- 8 chapter 91 to effectuate this section.
- 9 (e) For purposes of this section, "agriculture" or
- 10 "agricultural" includes the fields of farming, diversified
- 11 agriculture, landscaping, aquaculture, culinary arts, and
- 12 related industries such as market development and science and
- 13 technology."
- 14 SECTION 3. The department of education shall consult with
- 15 the department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii's
- 16 college of tropical agriculture and human resources and college
- 17 of education in the development and implementation of the
- 18 agriculture education program established under this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. The department of education shall submit a
- 20 report to the legislature regarding:
- 21 (1) Its activities toward implementation of the
- agriculture education program;

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(2) Its development and implementation of the agricultural 1 and culinary education program; and 2 (3) Any requests for funding to further implement the 3 agriculture education program and the agricultural and 4 culinary education program, 5 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 6 sessions of 2008 and 2009. The first report shall include a 7 description of department activities between July 1, 2006, and 8 9 June 30, 2007, toward implementing Act 233, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, which established a vocational agriculture 10 11 education program. SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 12 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the 14 15 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 16 2008-2009, to support and maintain a comprehensive agriculture education program in the public schools as provided in section 2 17 18 of this Act. 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of education for the purposes of section 2 of this Act. 20 21 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so

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- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 2 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 3 year 2008-2009, for the establishment and administration of the
- 4 agricultural and culinary education program as provided in this
- 5 Act.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 7 of education for the purposes of establishing and administering
- 8 the agricultural and culinary education program pursuant to
- 9 section 2 of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
