A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES OF COMMITTED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health 2 services in correctional facilities throughout the State of Hawaii are alarmingly inadequate and have been the subject of 3 ongoing federal investigation. These inadequacies have created 4 5 conditions that threaten the constitutional rights of the committed persons detained therein. 6 The legislature further finds that up to forty per cent of 7 8 the committed persons in the State's correctional facilities are mentally ill. A recent federal Department of Justice study 10 found many insufficiencies including: 11 Inadequate staffing, including a director of mental (1)health services and trained mental health 12 13 professionals; 14 (2) A lack of individualized treatment planning and documentation: 15 16 A confusing and inconsistent organizational structure; (3) 17 (4)Outdated and unused policies and procedures; and

- 1 (5) An inadequate access to psychiatric hospitalization.
- 2 The purpose of this Act is to provide funds to the
- 3 department of public safety to remedy the inadequacies of mental
- 4 health care services to committed persons in Hawaii state
- 5 correctional facilities and monitor its progress.
- 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000, or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 9 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2008-2009, for improvements to the mental health care system of
- 11 committed persons in state-operated correctional facilities that
- 12 will address the concerns of the federal Department of Justice.
- 13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 14 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. The department of public safety shall report to
- 16 the legislature by November 1, 2007, with a detailed mental
- 17 health plan that addresses the federal Department of Justice's
- 18 concerns.
- 19 SECTION 4. The department of public safety shall report to
- 20 the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the
- 21 commencement of the 2009 regular session with its achievements,
- 22 continuing improvements and on going problems in providing the

- 1 appropriate mental health care to committed persons under its
- 2 jurisdiction.

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
