## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES OF COMMITTED PERSONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health
 services at the Oahu community correctional center are
 alarmingly inadequate and have been the subject of ongoing
 federal investigation. These inadequacies have created
 conditions that threaten the constitutional rights of the
 committed persons detained therein.

7 The legislature further finds that up to forty per cent of 8 the committed persons in the State's correctional facilities are 9 mentally ill. Recent communications with experts retained by 10 the federal Department of Justice have noted many

11 insufficiencies including:

12 (1) Inadequate staffing, including a lack of a director of
13 mental health services and trained mental health
14 professionals;

- 15 (2) A lack of individualized treatment planning and16 documentation;
- 17 (3) A confusing and inconsistent organizational structure;

(4) Outdated and unused policies and procedures; and 1 2 (5) An inadequate access to psychiatric hospitalization. 3 The purpose of this Act is to provide funds to the department of public safety to remedy the inadequacies of mental 4 health care services to committed persons in Hawaii state 5 correctional facilities and monitor its progress. 6 7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the 10 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 11 2008-2009, for improvements to the mental health care system of 12 committed persons in state-operated correctional facilities that will address the concerns expressed by the experts retained by 13 14 the federal Department of Justice. 15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

16 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. The department of public safety shall report to
the legislature by November 1, 2007, with a detailed mental
health plan that addresses the following:

20 (1) An assessment of the department's existing resources21 and staffing that is in place, additional resources

1		and staffing needed to come up to standard, and needs
2		to keep up with future demands;
3	(2)	The use of alternative services, such as the use of
4		telemedicine to provide mental health services to
5		incarcerated offenders;
6	(3)	The completion of departmental training and policy
7		manual;
8	(4)	The appropriate type of updated record keeping system;
9	(5)	An update on the feasibility study initiated by the
10		departments of health and public safety regarding the
11		expansion of the Hawaii state hospital to include an
12		offender wing so as to be able to adequately treat
13		mental health patients who are incarcerated; and
14	(6)	Any other suggestions or ideas to improve the mental
15		health services to incarcerated individuals and to
16		comply with local, state, and federal laws and
17		mandates.
18	This report shall be submitted in a form understandable by lay	
19	readers and made available to the public.	
20	SECT	ION 4. The department of public safety shall report to
21	the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the	
22	commencement of the 2008 regular session, and every session
