A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the interagency working group established pursuant to part VIII of Act 51, 2 Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, the "Reinventing Education Act of 3 2004," as amended by Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006 (Act 4 51, as amended), has recommended to the legislature that the 5 transfer of functions from the department of health to the 6 department of education specified in Act 51, as amended, be 7 8 amended to repeal the transfer of the public health nurses who supervise school health aides. The school health aides are 9 scheduled to transfer July 1, 2007, from the department of 10 health to the department of education. 11

12 The interagency working group report states that the 13 department of education and the department of health supported 14 the transfer of the school health aides and the repeal of the 15 transfer of the public health nurses who supervise school health 16 aides. The report also stated that the Hawaii Government 17 Employees Association opposed the transfer of the school health



1 aides. The Hawaii Government Employees Association stated that 2 their objection to any transfer of state employees to the 3 department of education is based on their concern for the 4 employees whose positions and funds might be allocated to the schools through the weighted student formula. The department of 5 6 education stated that a policy decision has been made not to allocate the school health aides positions through the weighted 7 8 student formula for the fiscal biennium 2007-2009.

The legislature further finds that the department of 9 education and the department of health have agreed that the 10 public health nurses who supervise the school health aides 11 should remain at the department of health and provide clinical 12 supervision to the school health aides through a service level 13 14 agreement or memorandum of understanding. Both departments recognize that transferring the public health nurse positions to 15 16 the department of education would require the department of health to request replacement positions to carry out essential 17 public health functions. Additionally, the number of public 18 19 health nurses that would be transferred to the department of 20 education would be insufficient to provide the level of supervision necessary for the school health services program. 21 22 As a result, both departments have concluded that the best



method of supporting the school health services program is to
 provide clinical supervision for school health aides through a
 service level agreement or memorandum of understanding.

The school health aides are the primary component of the school health services program established within the department of health. With the transfer of the school health aides to the department of education, the program should also be transferred to the department of education.

9 The purpose of this Act is to repeal the transfer of the 10 public health nurses who supervise the school health aides from 11 the department of health to the department of education and 12 repeal the school health services program from chapter 321, 13 Hawaii Revised Statutes, and enact the program in chapter 302A, 14 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

15 SECTION 2. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended 16 by Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is amended by amending 17 section 47 to read as follows:

State. It is in the general welfare of the State to protect,
 preserve, care for, and improve the physical and mental health
 of Hawaii's children by making available at the public schools
 first aid and emergency care, preventive health care, health
 appraisals and follow-ups, and health room facilities.

6 §302A-Teenage health program. The department, in 7 cooperation with the department of health, may establish a statewide teenage health program designed to enhance 8 9 self-esteem, facilitate communication between students and their parents, incorporate ho`oponopono techniques in group 10 11 discussions, expand peer counseling efforts, and provide more counseling opportunities. In implementing this program, the 12 department shall strive to respect and include the diverse needs 13 and values of parents and teens served by the program. 14

15 §302A- Department implementation. The department shall 16 implement this program with the present health services now 17 provided to those schools under the pilot project established 18 under Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 1970, to each public 19 school, and further provide the necessary number of health aides 20 in order to service each public school. The department may 21 provide health related screening services at each public school.



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
