A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that the interagency 1 SECTION 1. 2 working group established pursuant to part VIII of Act 51, 3 Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, the "Reinventing Education Act of 4 2004," as amended by Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006 (Act 5 51, as amended), has recommended to the legislature that the 6 transfer of functions from the department of health to the 7 department of education specified in Act 51, as amended, be 8 amended to repeal the transfer of the public health nurses who 9 supervise school health aides. The school health aides are 10 scheduled to transfer July 1, 2007, from the department of 11 health to the department of education.

12 The interagency working group report states that the 13 department of education and the department of health supported 14 the transfer of the school health aides and the repeal of the 15 transfer of the public health nurses who supervise school health 16 aides. The report also stated that the Hawaii Government 17 Employees Association opposed the transfer of the school health



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The Hawaii Government Employees Association stated that 1 aides. 2 its objection to any transfer of state employees to the 3 department of education is based on its concern for those employees whose positions and funds might be allocated to the 4 schools through the weighted student formula. The department of 5 education stated that a policy decision has been made not to 6 7 allocate the school health aides positions through the weighted student formula for the fiscal biennium 2007-2009. 8

9 The legislature further finds that the department of 10 education and the department of health have agreed that those 11 public health nurses who supervise the school health aides should remain at the department of health and provide clinical 12 13 supervision to the school health aides through a service level 14 agreement or memorandum of understanding. Both departments 15 recognize that transferring the public health nurse positions to 16 the department of education would require the department of health to request replacement positions to carry out essential 17 public health functions. Additionally, the number of public 18 19 health nurses that would be transferred to the department of 20 education would be insufficient to provide the level of 21 supervision necessary for the school health services program. 22 As a result, both departments have concluded that the best



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method of supporting the school health services program is to 1 2 provide clinical supervision for school health aides through a 3 service level agreement or memorandum of understanding. 4 The school health aides are the primary component of the 5 school health services program established within the department 6 of health. With the transfer of the school health aides to the 7 department of education, the program should also be transferred 8 to the department of education. 9 The purpose of this Act is to: 10 Repeal the transfer from the department of health to (1)11 the department of education those public health nurses 12 who supervise the school health aides; and 13 (2) Repeal the school health services program from chapter 14 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and enact the program in chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 15 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 18 to read as follows: 19 "PART . SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM 20 §302A-Purpose; establishment of program. The purpose of this part is to establish a statewide school health services 21 22 There shall be within the department a permanent program.



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1 comprehensive school health services program for grades
2 kindergarten through twelve in all the public schools of this
3 state. It is in the general welfare of the state to protect,
4 preserve, care for, and improve the physical and mental health
5 of Hawaii's children by making available at the public schools
6 first aid and emergency care, preventive health care, health
7 appraisals and follow-ups, and health room facilities.

8 \$302A-Teenage health program. The department, in 9 cooperation with the department of health, may establish a 10 statewide teenage health program designed to enhance self-esteem, facilitate communication between students and their 11 parents, incorporate ho'oponopono techniques in group 12 13 discussions, expand peer counseling efforts, and provide more 14 counseling opportunities. In implementing this program, the 15 department shall strive to respect and include the diverse needs 16 and values of parents and teenagers served by the program.

17 §302A- Department implementation. The department shall 18 implement this program with the present health services now 19 provided to those schools under the pilot project established 20 under Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 1970, to each public 21 school, and further provide the necessary number of health aides

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1	to serve	each public school. The department may provide health-	
2	related screening services at each public school.		
3	Scho	ol health aides may assist students by administering	
4	oral and	topical medication, and in emergency situations, other	
5	premeasur	ed medication; provided that:	
6	(1)	If the student receiving the medication is a minor, a	
7		parent or guardian requests and authorizes the	
8		administration of medication;	
9	(2)	The medication has been prescribed by a licensed	
10		physician, as defined in section 334-1, or by a	
11		practitioner with prescriptive authority;	
12	(3)	The administration of the medication is with the	
13		approval of the department of health; and	
14	(4)	The administration of the medication is necessary for	
15		the health of the student and for the student's	
16		attendance at school.	
17	§302	A- School health aides. All full-time school health	
18	aides employed in the department shall be employed and have		
19	their compensation fixed in accordance with chapter 76 and the		
20	appropriate collective bargaining agreement, executive order,		

21 executive directive, or rule; provided that the compensation



1 shall be based on a six and one-half hour work day; provided 2 further that: 3 The monthly rate of compensation for all school health (1)4 aides employed less than full-time shall be based on 5 the number of hours they actually work; (2) The monthly rate of compensation for full-time health 6 aides so determined shall be multiplied by ten and 7 8 then divided by twelve and the resulting amount shall 9 be the employee's monthly salary payable over a twelve-month period; and 10 The health aides shall have the same working schedule 11 (3) 12 and leave allowance as school teachers in the 13 department. Rules. The superintendent of education shall 14 §302A-15 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for the purposes of this 16 part." 17 SECTION 3. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended by Act 221, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended by Act 22, 18 19 Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, as amended by Act 225, Session Laws 20 of Hawaii 2006, is amended by amending section 47 to read as

21 follows:



1	"SECTION 47. (a) All the rights, powers, functions,	
2	duties, and resources of:	
3	(1) The department of budget and finance relating to the:	
4	(A) Funding of collective bargaining agreement	
5	increases; and	
6	(B) Securing, administering, use, and expending of	
7	federal funds and other aid, including their	
8	custodial supervision; and	
9	(2) The department of health relating to school health	
10	aides [and public health nurses who supervise school	
11	health-aides;],	
12	are transferred to the department of education effective	
13	July 1, 2007, subject to repeal by subsequent legislation.	
14	(b) All moneys budgeted in support of each position to be	
15	transferred to the department of education, including moneys for	
16	direct and indirect employee benefits, are transferred to the	
17	department of education effective July 1, 2007, subject to	
18	repeal by subsequent legislation."	
19	SECTION 4. Effective July 1, 2007, the department of	
20	education shall provide career pathways development and training	
21	opportunities to all school health aides in the school health	
22	services field and other fields within the department of	
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education to ensure the opportunity for continued employment
 with the department of education.
 SECTION 5. Chapter 321, part XIX, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
 is repealed.
 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2007.

Public Health Nurses; School Health Services Program; Transfers

Description:

Repeals the transfer of the public health nurses who supervise school health aides from the department of health to the department of education; establishes the school health services program in chapter 302A, HRS; repeals the school health services program in chapter 321, HRS. (SB98 HD1)
