A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRECURSORS TO THE MANUFACTURE OF CONTROLLED
SUBSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 329-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "~~[+]~~ §329-70 ~~[+]~~ **Forfeiture.** (a) Precursor chemicals that
4 are possessed, transferred, sold, or offered for sale in
5 violation of this part shall be subject to seizure and
6 forfeiture as provided in chapter 712A.

7 (b) All conveyances, including aircraft, vehicles, or
8 vessels that are used, or intended for use, to transport or in
9 any manner facilitate the transportation of precursor chemicals
10 for a purpose that would constitute a violation of section
11 329-65(c) or (d), shall be subject to seizure and forfeiture as
12 provided in chapter 712A.

13 (c) All moneys, negotiable instruments, securities, or
14 other things of value furnished or intended to be furnished by
15 any person in exchange for any of the substances listed in
16 section 329-61 that facilitate any violation of section 329-
17 65(c) or (d), and all proceeds traceable to such an exchange,




1 and all moneys, negotiable instruments, and securities used or
2 intended to be used to facilitate any violation of section
3 329-65(c) or (d), shall be subject to seizure and forfeiture as
4 provided in chapter 712A."

5 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
7 begun, before its effective date.

8 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
