# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HA'IKU VALLEY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that Ha'iku valley on Oahu has significant cultural and historic importance to the 2 3 native people of Hawai'i. Ha'iku valley is renowned for its 4 archaeological and other cultural and historic sites, including 5 lo'i, sacred sites, and burial sites, and for the presence of 6 native and endangered flora and fauna. Preserving the valley's 7 cultural and historic resources and educating the public about 8 these resources are of paramount importance. 9 The legislature further finds that ownership of the valley 10 is segmented among several entities. The valley's segmented 11 ownership and limited stewardship have placed its cultural and 12 historic resources at high risk. Adequate management and 13 appropriate access to the valley have proven elusive. 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Ha'iku Valley 15 cultural preserve commission, which shall have policy and 16 management oversight of the Ha'iku Valley cultural preserve. 17 The establishment of the commission will provide a system that

recognizes the valley's unique challenges and preserves in

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- 1 perpetuity its cultural and historic resources for the people of
- 2 Hawai'i.
- 3 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 4 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 "CHAPTER
- 7 HA'IKU VALLEY CULTURAL PRESERVE
- 8 S -1 Administration of chapter. The Ha'iku valley
- 9 cultural preserve commission and the office of Hawaiian affairs
- 10 shall administer this chapter.
- 11 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
- 12 context otherwise requires:
- "Commission" means the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve
- 14 commission.
- "Office" means the office of Hawaiian affairs.
- 16 "Valley cultural preserve" means the area designated as
- 17 Ha'iku valley.
- 18 § -3 Reservation of uses. (a) The Ha'iku valley
- 19 cultural preserve shall be used solely and exclusively for the
- 20 following purposes:

1	(1)	Preservation and practice of all rights customarily
2		and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for
3		cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes;
4	(2)	Preservation and protection of the area's cultural,
5		archaeological, historical, and environmental
6		resources;
7	(3)	Rehabilitation, revegetation, habitat restoration, and
8		preservation;
9	(4)	Education; and
10	(5)	Other purposes as determined by the commission.
11	(b)	The valley shall be reserved in perpetuity for the
12	uses enum	erated in this section. Commercial uses shall be
13	strictly	prohibited.
14	S	-4 Powers and duties of the office. The office and
15	other dep	artments and agencies of the State shall be subject to
16	the overs	ight of the commission with regard to the control and
17	managemen	t of the valley cultural preserve. Subject to section
18	-6, t	he office shall:
19	(1)	Implement controls and permitted uses for the valley
20		cultural preserve;
21	(2)	Enforce this chapter;

(3) Provide administrative support to the commission; and

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1	(4)	Authorize those of its employees as it deems
2		reasonable and necessary to serve and execute warrants
3		and arrest offenders or issue citations in all matters
4		relating to enforcement of the laws and rules
5		applicable to the valley cultural preserve.
6	S	-5 Commission. (a) There is established the Ha'iku
7	valley cu	ltural preserve commission to be placed within the
8	office of	Hawaiian affairs for administrative purposes as
9	provided	in section 26-35. The commission shall consist of nine
10	members t	o be appointed in the manner and to serve for the terms
11	provided	in section 26-34; provided that:
12	(1)	One member shall be a member of the Koʻolau
13		Foundation;
14	(2)	Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a
15		list provided by the Ko'olaupoko Hawaiian Civic Club;
16	(3)	One member shall be a representative of the office of
17		Hawaiian affairs;
18	(4)	One member shall be an official of the city and county
19		of Honolulu appointed by the governor from a list of
20		nominees provided by the mayor of the city and county
21		of Honolulu;

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1	(5)	One	member	shall	be	a	representative	of	the	board	of
2		land	d and r	natural	res	SOU	irces;				

- (6) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
   list provided by native Hawaiian organizations; and
- 5 (7) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a list provided by the kupa aina families living on the kuleana lands in the valley cultural preserve.
- 8 (b) The chairperson shall be elected from among the9 members of the commission and by the members of the commission.
- 10 (c) The members of the commission shall serve without pay,
  11 but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
  12 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
  13 duties.
- (d) Any action taken by the commission shall be approved by a simple majority of its members. Five members shall constitute a quorum to do business.
- 17 (e) The commission, without regard to the requirements of 18 chapter 76, may hire employees necessary to perform its duties.
- 19 § -6 Powers and duties of the commission. The general 20 administration of the valley cultural preserve shall rest with 21 the commission. The commission:

1	(1)	Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for
2		permissible uses within the valley cultural preserve;
3	(2)	Shall approve all contracts for services and rules
4		pertaining to the valley cultural preserve;
5	(3)	Shall provide advice to the office, the governor, the
6		department of land and natural resources, and other
7		departments and agencies on any matter relating to the
8		valley cultural preserve;
9	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the
10		department of the attorney general on any matter
11		relating to the conveyance of the valley cultural
12		preserve to the office;
13	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with
14		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community
15		organizations for the perpetuation of native Hawaiian
16		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,
17		and practices;
18	(6)	Shall have those powers and duties concerning the
19		valley cultural preserve otherwise conferred upon the
20		city and county of Honolulu by chapter 205A;

1	(7)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
2	* .	are necessary to administer this chapter and shall
3		maintain a record of its proceedings and actions;
4	(8)	May delegate to any executive director or employees of
5		the commission, by formal commission action, such
6		power and authority vested in the commission by this
7		chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper
8		for the effective administration of this chapter; and
9	(9)	May solicit and accept grants, donations, and
10		contributions for deposit into the Ha'iku valley
11		cultural preserve trust fund to support the purposes
12		of this chapter.
13	S	-7 Farming. Notwithstanding section -3, the
14	commissio	n shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to permit
15	farming a	ctivities in the valley cultural preserve that are
16	consisten	t with the purposes of this chapter and that take into
17	considera	tion the health and safety of the general public.

-8 Penalty. Any person who violates any of the laws

or rules applicable to the valley cultural preserve shall be

guilty of a petty misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than

\$1,000, imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, for each

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- 1 offense. Each day of each violation shall be deemed a separate
- 2 offense.
- 3 S -9 General administrative penalties. (a) Except as
- 4 otherwise provided by law, the commission is authorized to set,
- 5 charge, and collect administrative fines, or bring legal action
- 6 to recover administrative costs of the commission or the office,
- 7 or collect payment for damages or for the cost of correcting
- 8 damages resulting from a violation of this chapter or any rule
- 9 adopted hereunder. The administrative fines shall be as
- 10 follows:
- 11 (1) For a first violation, a fine of not more than
- 12 \$10,000;
- 13 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous
- violation, a fine of not more than \$15,000; and
- 15 (3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years
- 16 of the last violation, a fine of not more than
- \$25,000.
- 18 (b) In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000
- 19 may be levied for each specimen of natural resource or any
- 20 historic property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in
- 21 violation of any rule adopted under this chapter.

- 1 (c) The remedies or penalties provided by this chapter are
- 2 cumulative to each other and to the remedies and penalties
- 3 provided by any other law.
- 4 (d) In any judicial proceeding to recover an
- 5 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show
- 6 that:
- 7 (1) Notice was given;
- 8 (2) A hearing was held or the time granted for requesting
- 9 a hearing has run without such a request;
- 10 (3) An administrative penalty was imposed; and
- 11 (4) The administrative penalty remains unpaid.
- (e) For purposes of this section:
- 13 "Natural resource" includes any archaeological artifacts,
- 14 minerals, any aquatic life or wildlife or parts thereof,
- 15 including their eggs, and any land plants or parts thereof,
- 16 including seeds.
- "Historic property" means any building, structure, object,
- 18 district, landscape, area, or site, including a heiau and an
- 19 underwater site, that is over fifty years old.
- 20 § -10 Transfer. Upon its conveyance to the office, all
- 21 terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting the valley
- 22 shall remain in effect unless expressly terminated.

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- 2 There is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be
- 3 designated as the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve trust fund to
- 4 be administered by the office with the prior approval of the
- 5 commission. Subject to this chapter:
- 6 (1) All moneys received from the federal government for
- 7 purposes consistent with this chapter;
- 8 (2) Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the
- 9 trust fund;
- 10 (3) Any moneys received from grants, donations, or the
- 11 proceeds from contributions; and
- 12 (4) The interest or return on investments earned from
- moneys in the trust fund,
- 14 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 15 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
- 16 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 17 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 18 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 19 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 21 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 22 the trust fund is terminated.

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- (d) If the trust fund is terminated, all funds shall be
- 2 transferred to the general fund; provided that all unexpended or
- 3 unencumbered balances shall be disbursed in accordance with any
- 4 requirements set by funding sources and for purposes consistent
- 5 with this chapter.
- 6 (e) The commission shall submit an annual report on the
- 7 status of the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve trust fund to the
- 8 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 9 each regular session of the legislature. The annual report
- 10 shall include the total number of and amount of grants,
- 11 donations, and contributions received and balances remaining on
- 12 June 30 of each year.
- 13 § -12 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 14 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 15 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 16 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 17 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 18 provisions of this chapter are severable."
- 19 SECTION 3. The office of planning and the department of
- 20 the attorney general, after consulting with the Ha'iku valley
- 21 cultural preserve commission, are authorized to initiate the
- 22 conveyance of all of the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve in fee

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- 1 simple to the office of Hawaiian affairs; provided that before
- 2 the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve is conveyed to the office,
- 3 agreements shall be executed with respect to liability, monetary
- 4 resources, and removal of hazardous wastes.
- 5 SECTION 4. (a) To implement this Act, the department of
- 6 land and natural resources and any other department with an
- 7 interest in lands within the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve,
- 8 with oversight from the office of planning and the department of
- 9 the attorney general pursuant to section 3 of this Act, are
- 10 directed to deed to the office of Hawaiian affairs the lands
- 11 within the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve.
- 12 (b) To further implement this Act, the governor is
- 13 directed to set aside the lands within the Ha'iku valley
- 14 cultural preserve.
- 15 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 18 the purposes of this Act, including but not limited to the
- 19 acquisition of the Ha'iku valley cultural preserve by the office
- 20 of Hawaiian affairs.
- 21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 22 Hawaiian affairs for the purposes of this Act.



- 1 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun, before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 5 provided that section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
