A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BURGLARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§708-A Burglary in the first degree. (1) A person		
5	commits t	he offense of burglary in the first degree if the	
6	person:		
7	<u>(a)</u>	Intentionally enters or remains unlawfully in a	
8		dwelling, with intent to commit therein a crime	
9		against a person or against property rights; and	
10	<u>(b)</u>	Is armed with a dangerous instrument in the course of	
11		committing the offense. An act occurs "in the course	
12		of committing the offense" if it occurs in effecting	
13		entry or while in the building or in immediate flight	
14		therefrom.	
15	(2)	Burglary in the first degree is a class A felony.	
16	(3)	For purposes of this section, "dangerous instrument"	
17	means any	device or weapon whose primary purpose is to cause	
18	death or	serious bodily harm, and includes but is not limited to

4	SECT	ION 2. Section 708-810, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
5	amended to read as follows:		
6	"§70	8-810 Burglary in the [first] second degree. (1) A	
7	person con	mmits the offense of burglary in the [first] second	
8	degree if	the person intentionally enters or remains unlawfully	
9	in a build	ding, with intent to commit therein a crime against a	
10	person or	against property rights, and:	
11	(a)	The person is armed with a dangerous instrument in the	
12		course of committing the offense; [er]	
13	(b)	The person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly	
14		inflicts or attempts to inflict bodily injury on	
15		anyone in the course of committing the offense[+]. An	
16		act occurs "in the course of committing the offense"	
17		if it occurs in effecting entry or while in the

- 8 SECTION 3. Section 708-811, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§708-811 Burglary in the [second] third degree. (1) A
- 11 person commits the offense of burglary in the [second] third
- 12 degree if the person intentionally enters or remains unlawfully
- 13 in a building with intent to commit therein a crime against a
- 14 person or against property rights.
- 15 (2) Burglary in the [second] third degree is a class C
- 16 felony."
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 18 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 19 begun, before its effective date.
- 20 SECTION 5. In codifying the new section added by section 1
- 21 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute the

- 1 appropriate section number for the letter used in designating
- 2 the new section in this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
