A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Federally qualified health centers are located 1 2 in medically underserved communities and serve medically 3 underserved populations. Among the federally qualified health centers in Hawaii, 4 there are health centers which are either located in communities 5 with a large percentage of Hawaiian homesteads, or a large 6 percentage of native Hawaiians, or both. The role of these 7 centers is especially important in addressing the poor health 8 statistics experienced by native Hawaiians. 9 10 The federal Native Hawaiian Health Care Improvement Act identifies a native Hawaiian health center as an entity: 11 Which is organized under the laws of the State of 12 (1)13 Hawaii; Which provides or arranges for health care services 14 (2) through practitioners licensed by the State of Hawaii, 15 where licensure requirements are applicable; 16 17 (3) Which is a public or nonprofit private entity; and

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1	(4) In which native Hawaiian health practitioners		
2	significantly participate in the planning, management,		
3	monitoring, and evaluation of health services.		
4	The purpose of this Act is to establish a state designation		
5	of native Hawaiian health centers. The criteria for designation		
6	as a native Hawaiian health center shall follow that of the		
7	Native Hawaiian Health Care Improvement Act, Title 42 United		
8	States Code Sections 11701-11714.		
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
11	and to read as follows:		
12	" <u>§321-</u> <u>Native Hawaiian health center; state designation.</u>		
13	(a) A native Hawaiian health center shall be any organization		
14	that is a primary health care provider that:		
15	(1) Has a governing board composed of individuals of which		
16	at least fifty per cent of the individuals on the		
17	governing board consist of native Hawaiians;		
18	(2) Demonstrates cultural competency in a predominately		
19	native Hawaiian community. For purposes of this		
20	section, "cultural competency" means having an overall		
21	pervasive health care environment reflecting native		
22	Hawaiian values and having professional capacity to		
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1		apply those values in the treatment and care of native
2		Hawaiians and others, including but not limited to the
3		language and traditional practices;
4	(3)	Serves a patient population that:
5		(A) Is made up of individuals at least fifty per cent
6		of whom are native Hawaiian; or
7		(B) Has not less that two thousand five hundred
8		native Hawaiians as annual users of services;
9	(4)	Is affiliated with a native Hawaiian health care
10		system through a memorandum of understanding or
11		agreement; and
12	(5)	Is recognized by Papa Ola Lokahi as having met each of
13		the criteria in paragraphs (1), (2), and (3).
14	(b)	The director of health, in consultation and
15	collabora	tion with Papa Ola Lokahi, shall adopt rules pursuant
16	to chapte	r 91 to effectuate the purposes of designating native
17	Hawaiian	health centers."
18	SECT	ION 3. Until such time as there is a sovereign
19	Hawaiian	nation recognized by the United States and the State of
20	Hawaii, t	he department of health shall coordinate with Papa Ola
21	Lokahi to	oversee the implementation of state health programs



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1 resulting from the designation of native Hawaiian health 2 centers. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 3 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for 5 the development and establishment of a state-recognized 6 designation of native Hawaiian health centers. 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 9 health for the purposes of this Act. SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007. 11
