A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1	. Section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

17		less] no fewer than [10,000] ten thousand hours

1		of experience in the trade under the supervision
2		of a journey worker or supervising electrician.
3	(2)	Journey worker specialty electrician. Every applicant
4		to be eligible for the journey worker specialty
5		electrician examination shall be at least eighteen
6		years of age and shall [have]:
7		(A) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
8		successfully completed an accredited academic
9		program and five-year apprenticeship program
10		covering the principles of electrical theory and
11		the requirements of the National Electric Code;
12		<u>or</u>
13		(B) <u>Have</u> had at least five [years] <u>years</u> experience
14		in the trade.
15	(3)	Supervising electrician. Every applicant to be
16		eligible for the supervising electrician examination
17		shall [have]:
18		(A) Have been registered with the board as a journey
19		worker electrician for at least a period of four
20		years in the trade or shall have had equivalent
21		experience in the trade[+]; and

15			successfully completed an accredited academic
16			program and five-year apprenticeship program
17			covering the principles of electrical theory and
18			the requirements of the National Electric Code.
19	(5)	Jour	ney worker plumber. Every applicant to be
20		elig	ible for the journey worker plumber examination
21		shal	l have had at least five years of full-time
22		expe	rience [of at least five years' full time] or its

1		equivalent but [not less] no fewer than [10,000] ten
2		thousand hours as a journey worker's or master
3		plumber's helper, and [is] be able to furnish
4		satisfactory evidence of such fact.
5	(6)	Master plumber. Every applicant to be eligible for
6		the master plumber examination shall have been
7		registered with the board as a journey worker plumber
8		for at least two years or shall have had equivalent
9		experience in the trade.
10	(7)	Maintenance electrician. Every applicant to be
11		eligible for the maintenance electrician examination
12		shall [be]:
13		(A) Be not less than eighteen years of age;
14		(B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
15		successfully completed an accredited academic
16		program or a five-year apprenticeship program
17		covering the principles of electrical theory and
18		the requirements of the National Electric Code;
19		[and shall have] or;
20		(C) Have had at least one year of experience in
21		performing electrical maintenance work or proof

1			of two years of schooling in the electrical
2			trade.
3	(8)	Jour	ney worker industrial electrician. Every
4		appl	icant to be eligible for the journey worker
5		indu	strial electrician examination shall [be]:
6		<u>(A)</u>	Be at least eighteen years of age;
7		<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
8			successfully completed an accredited academic
9			program and a five-year apprenticeship program
10			covering the principles of electrical theory and
11			the requirements of the National Electric Code;
12			[and shall have] or
13		<u>(C)</u>	Have had at least five years of full-time
14			experience in industrial electrical work [of at
15			least five years full time] or its equivalent[-
16			but not less]; provided that such experience
17			shall not be less than [10,000] ten thousand
18			hours.
19	(9)	Supe	rvising industrial electrician. Every applicant
20		to b	e eligible for the supervising industrial
21		elec	trician examination shall [have]:

1	(A)	<u>Have</u> been registered with the board as a journey
2		worker industrial electrician for a period of at
3		least four years or shall have had equivalent
4		experience in the trade[-]; and
5	<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
6		successfully completed an accredited academic
7		program and a five-year apprenticeship program
8		covering the principles of electrical theory and
9		the requirements of the National Electric Code.
10	SECTION 2	. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read	d as follows:
12	" [-[] §448E	-5.5[] Examination. (a) Every applicant shall
13	be examined and	d shall pass an examination to be eligible for
14	licensure. The	e board shall provide in its rules the passing
15	score for the	examination. The board may examine applicants or
16	may contract w	ith professional testing services to prepare,
17	administer, and	d grade the examination as may be required for the
18	purpose of this	s section.
19	(b) Every	y applicant shall pay an examination fee as
20	provided in rul	les adopted by the director pursuant to chapter
21	91. Should the	board contract with a professional testing
22	agency to prepa	are, administer, and grade the examination, the

- 1 examination fee may be paid directly to the testing agency by
- 2 the director or the examinee.
- 3 (c) The examinations for all levels of electricians shall
- 4 test the applicant's knowledge of the principles of electrical
- 5 theory and the requirements of the National Electric Code. The
- 6 examinations shall test the applicant at the level of knowledge
- 7 gained through the successful completion of an associate degree
- 8 or certification program in electrical theory or electrical
- 9 apprenticeship from an accredited institution."
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun, before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
- 16 provided that the amendments made by section 1 of this Act to
- 17 paragraphs (3), (4), and (9) of section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised
- 18 Statutes, shall take effect four years from the effective date
- 19 of this Act.
