
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the Governor for
2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
3 the Hawaii State Constitution.

4 SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to make an emergency
5 appropriation for emergency relief operations in the counties of
6 Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the city and county of Honolulu as a
7 result of the October 15, 2006, Kiholo Bay earthquake disaster
8 as follows:

9 (1) Cover the costs of statewide response and recovery
10 efforts to repair damaged homes, public buildings,
11 transportation infrastructure, utilities, irrigation
12 systems, hospitals, and nursing homes, especially on
13 the islands of Hawaii and Maui;

14 (2) Cover the required twenty-five per cent cost share for
15 the Federal Emergency Management Agency's public
16 assistance program and individual assistance program,
17 as required by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster and
18 Emergency Assistance Act, and for the Natural



- 1 Resources Conservative Service emergency watershed
2 protection program;
- 3 (3) Upgrade state and county warning systems by providing
4 emergency generators to selected critical facilities
5 such as radio and television stations to ensure
6 continuity of operations in informing the general
7 public of potential immediate risks;
- 8 (4) Hire consultants to:
- 9 (A) Investigate and survey alternate sources of
10 irrigation water for Hawaii island; and
- 11 (B) Develop and coordinate plans for public and
12 private partnerships to improve and to protect
13 sources and distribution of irrigation water on
14 Hawaii island; and
- 15 (5) Provide financial assistance to critical facilities
16 such as public schools, hospitals, and nursing
17 facilities for structural and non-structural
18 mitigation projects.

19 The legislature finds and declares the appropriations under
20 this Act are in the public interest and ensures public health,
21 safety, and general welfare of the State.



1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$900,000, or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2006-2007, to cover
4 operational expenses associated with earthquake disaster
5 recovery efforts, including but not limited to national guard
6 personnel on state active duty and helicopter operating
7 expenses.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9 defense for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
11 budget reserve fund, established pursuant to section 328L-3,
12 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of \$24,000,000, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
14 earthquake disaster recovery projects to include the twenty-five
15 per cent non-federal cost share for all earthquake disaster
16 recovery projects made eligible under the Federal Emergency
17 Management Agency's public assistance program; provided that any
18 reimbursements made to the State by the Federal Emergency
19 Management Agency shall be redeposited into the emergency and
20 budget reserve fund.

21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
22 defense for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 5. Each department or agency expending funds
2 authorized by this Act shall submit reports to the legislature
3 no later than January 15, 2008. The information contained in
4 the reports shall:

- 5 (1) Be organized by county;
- 6 (2) Provide summaries of expenditure data on a statewide
7 basis; and
- 8 (3) Include:
 - 9 (A) The date of each expenditure;
 - 10 (B) The purpose and description of each expenditure;
 - 11 (C) The identification of any recipient of payments
12 from each expenditure; and
 - 13 (D) For funds not authorized by this Act but
14 nevertheless used by any department or agency for
15 the purposes of this Act:
 - 16 (i) The source of those funds, by specific
17 program;
 - 18 (ii) The impact to the programs originally funded
19 by those funds; and
 - 20 (iii) The need for any emergency appropriations
21 that resulted from the diversion of those
22 funds.



1 SECTION 6. Any provision of the Act to the contrary
2 notwithstanding, the appropriations under this Act shall not
3 lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations
4 were made. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
5 appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
6 June 30, 2008, shall lapse.

7 SECTION 7. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
8 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
9 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
10 that the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2006-
11 2007 (established at \$5,357,987,705 on November 8, 2006) has
12 already been exceeded by \$90,137,694 or 1.68 per cent. The
13 appropriations contained in section 3 will cause the state
14 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2006-2007 to be
15 exceeded by an additional \$900,000, or an additional 0.017 per
16 cent. The calculation contained in the foregoing sentence
17 relates only to the amount of general funds appropriated in this
18 Act for fiscal year 2006-2007. The reasons for exceeding the
19 general fund expenditure ceiling are that the appropriations
20 made in section 3 are necessary to serve the public interest and
21 to meet the needs provided for by section 3.

22 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.



REPORT Title:

Emergency Appropriation; Natural Disasters

Description:

Makes emergency appropriations of \$900,000 in general funds to department of defense for FY 2006-2007, to cover operational expenses associated with the October 15, 2006, Kiholo Bay earthquake disaster recovery efforts in the counties of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the city and county of Honolulu. Makes emergency appropriations of \$24,000,000 from the emergency and budget reserve fund to cover the 25% non-federal cost share for earthquake disaster recovery projects made eligible under the Federal Emergency Management Agency public assistance program, for emergency watershed protection projects under the Natural Resources Conservative Service, upgrading State and county warning systems, repairing and improving irrigation water systems and repairing public school facilities, hospitals, and healthcare facilities; provided that any reimbursements from the Federal Emergency Management Agency shall be returned to the emergency and budget reserve fund. Funds will also be used for structural and non-structural earthquake mitigation projects.
