### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANATOMICAL GIFTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a critical 1 shortage of organ and tissue donors in the state. Many patients 2 are on waiting lists for kidney, liver, heart, lung, and other 3 organ and tissue transplants. The number of people requiring a 4 life-saving transplant continues to rise faster than the number 5 of available donors, especially among minority ethnic groups. 6 As of January 5, 2007, there were more than ninety-four thousand 7 patients awaiting transplants on the national waiting list. 8 Every thirteen minutes, a new name is added to the waiting list 9 and every day, an average of seventeen patients die while 10 In Hawaii, there are three hundred and seventy eight 11 waiting. patients waiting and for the past five years, an average of 12 nineteen patients have died while waiting for a second chance at 13 life. For various reasons, minority ethnic groups appear to be 14 at increased risk of suffering illnesses such as diabetes and 15 high blood pressure that can lead to organ failure, resulting in 16 the need for organ transplants. The success rate of organ 17 transplants is often improved when the donor and the recipient 18 SB HMS 2007-1532

are of the same ethnic or racial group. Therefore, a shortage
 of organ donors among certain minority ethnic groups may
 disproportionately impact patients belonging to that minority
 ethnic group.

However, the legislature further finds that difficulties 5 exist in making members of various minority ethnic groups aware 6 of the need for anatomical gifts. Education efforts need to be 7 undertaken to raise awareness among minority ethnic groups of 8 the importance of organ and tissue donation, and to encourage 9 such donations. Raising public awareness of the importance of 10 organ and tissue donation is in the public's interest, and 11 12 necessary for the public health, safety, and general welfare.

13 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii Organ
14 Procurement Organization, also known as the Organ Donor Center
15 of Hawaii, is a nonprofit organization under Section 501(c)3 of
16 the Internal Revenue Code. Incorporated on July 16, 1987, the
17 Organ Donor Center of Hawaii has coordinated efforts to procure
18 organ and tissue donations and find appropriate recipients for
19 the donations. This process includes:

- 20 (1) Evaluating potential donors;
- 21 (2) Presenting the option of donation to families;
  22 (3) Providing medical management to donors; and

1	(4) Placing organs according to nationally established
2	criteria.
3	The Health Care Financing Administration has designated the
4	Organ Donor Center of Hawaii as the "organ procurement
5	organization" for Hawaii under Section 1138 of the Social
6	Security Act.
7	The legislature further finds that the Organ Donor Center
8	of Hawaii is an organization that meets the requirements of
9	section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and that a grant to
10	this organization to raise public awareness of organ and tissue
11	donation and increase the number of individuals consenting to
12	organ donation is in the public interest, and for the public
13	health, safety, and general welfare.
14	The purpose of this Act is to increase the number of
15	individuals consenting to organ and tissue donation by expanding
16	and promoting public education and awareness programs on organ,

17 tissue, and eye donations, including the minority organ tissue 18 transplant education program.

19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$175,000 or so much 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the 22 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

2008-2009 for the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii to increase the
 number of individuals consenting to organ and tissue donation by
 expanding and promoting public education and awareness programs
 on organ, tissue, and eye donations, including the minority
 organ tissue transplant education program.

6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department7 of health for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
