# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii  
2 sustainability task force constitutes a combined effort of all  
3 state departments and agencies in the development and  
4 maintenance of sustainable communities that will generate their  
5 own energy onsite by using alternative energy sources to fulfill  
6 a large percentage of their energy requirements and become less  
7 reliant on imported fossil fuels. The legislature further finds  
8 that the Hawaiian Electric Company has already successfully  
9 implemented a Sun Power for Schools Program for twenty-six  
10 public schools on Oahu. Under the program, a partnership  
11 between the utility, the department of education, and the  
12 community, the utility installs, operates, and maintains solar  
13 electric systems using photovoltaic technology and helps the  
14 department of education develop teaching materials on renewable  
15 energy of all kinds.

16           The legislature finds that the utilization of alternative  
17 energy utilities on public school campuses will eventually pay



1 for itself and result in savings for the State, as well as  
 2 promote independence from out-of-state sources for imported oil.  
 3 The legislature believes that the provision of funding to  
 4 schools that endeavor to use renewable energy utilities will be  
 5 beneficial for the schools, the department of education, and the  
 6 State as a whole, as well as serve as a learning tool for  
 7 students in business, science, and math classes.

8 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for grants  
 9 for public schools that use alternative energy utilities on  
 10 their campuses.

11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so  
 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for  
 14 the provision of grants to individual public schools that use  
 15 alternative energy utilities on their campuses.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
 17 education for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
