## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAKUA.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	MAKUA VALLEY RESERVE
6	§ -1 Administration of chapter. The Makua valley
7	reserve commission and the department of land and natural
8	resources shall administer this chapter.
9	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
10	context otherwise requires:
11	"Commission" means the Makua valley reserve commission.
12	"Department" means the department of land and natural
13	resources.
14	"Valley reserve" means the area designated on the island of
15	Oahu as Makua valley, including the three ahupua'a of
16	Kahanahaiki, Makua, and Koi'ahi.

- 1 -3 Reservation of uses. (a) The Makua valley reserve 2 shall be used solely and exclusively for the following purposes: 3 (1) Preservation and practice of all rights customarily 4 and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for 5 cultural, spiritual, and subsistence purposes; (2) Preservation and protection of its archaeological, 6 7 historical, and environmental resources; 8 (3) Rehabilitation, revegetation, habitat restoration, and 9 preservation; and (4) Education. 10 The Makua valley shall be reserved in perpetuity for 11 (b) the uses enumerated in subsection (a). Commercial uses shall be 12 13 strictly prohibited. 14 -4 Powers and duties. The department and other departments and agencies of the State shall be subject to the 15 16 oversight of the commission with regard to the control and management of the valley reserve. Subject to section -6, the 17 18 department shall: 19 (1)Implement controls and permitted uses for the valley 20 reserve; 21 (2) Enforce this chapter; Provide administrative support to the commission; and 22 (3)

2		reasonable and necessary to serve and execute warrants
3		and arrest offenders or issue citations in all matters
4		relating to enforcement of the laws and rules
5		applicable to the valley reserve.
6	<b>s</b> -	-5 Commission. (a) There is established the Makua
7	valley res	serve commission to be placed within the department of
8	land and r	natural resources for administrative purposes as
9	provided i	in section 26-35. The commission shall consist of ten
10	members to	be appointed in the manner and to serve for the terms
11	provided i	in section 26-34; provided that:
12	(1)	One member shall be a member of Malama Makua;
13	(2)	One member shall be a member of Hui Malama O Makua;
14	(3)	One member shall be a member of Koa Mana;
15	(4)	One member shall be a representative of families that
16		were evicted from Makua valley or whose lands in Makua
17		valley were condemned by the federal government;
18	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
19		list provided by the Waianae coast community;
20	(6)	One member shall be a trustee or representative of the
21		office of Hawaiian affairs;

1	(7)	One member shall be the commanding officer of the
2		United States Army in the Pacific, or the commanding
3		officer's designee;

- 4 (8) One member shall be the adjutant general of the State
  5 of Hawaii, or the adjutant general's designee;
- 6 (9) One member shall be the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources; and
- 8 (10) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a9 list provided by native Hawaiian organizations.
- (b) The governor shall appoint the chairperson from amongthe members of the commission.
- 12 (c) The members of the commission shall serve without pay
- 13 but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
- 14 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
- 15 duties.
- 16 (d) Any action taken by the commission shall be approved
- 17 by a simple majority of its members. Four members shall
- 18 constitute a quorum to do business.
- 19 (e) The commission, without regard to the requirements of
- 20 chapters 76 and 77, may hire employees necessary to perform its
- 21 duties.

1	9	-6 Responsibilities and duties of the commission. The									
2	general a	dministration of the valley reserve shall rest with the									
3	commissio	n. In carrying out its duties and responsibilities,									
4	the commission:										
5	(1)	Shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for									
6		permissible uses within the valley reserve;									
7	(2)	Shall approve all contracts for services and rules									
8		pertaining to the valley reserve;									
9	(3)	Shall provide advice to the governor, the department,									
10		and other departments and agencies on any matter									
11		relating to the valley reserve;									
12	(4)	Shall provide advice to the office of planning and the									
13		department of the attorney general on any matter									
14		relating to the federal conveyance of Makua valley;									
15	(5)	May enter into curator or stewardship agreements with									
16		appropriate Hawaiian cultural and spiritual community									
17		organizations for the perpetuation of native Hawaiian									
18		cultural, religious, and subsistence customs, beliefs,									
19		and practices for the purposes stated in section -3;									
20	(6)	Shall carry out those powers and duties otherwise									
21		conferred upon the board of land and natural resources									
22		and the land use commission with regard to									

1	•	dispositions and approvals pertaining to the valley
2		reserve. All powers and duties of the board of land
3		and natural resources and the land use commission
4		concerning dispositions and approvals pertaining to
5		the valley reserve are transferred to the commission;
6	(7)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
7		valley reserve otherwise conferred upon the city and
8		county of Honolulu by chapter 205A. The powers and
9		duties of the city and county of Honolulu and its
10		agencies concerning coastal zone dispositions and
11		approvals pertaining to the valley reserve are
12		transferred to the commission;
13	(8)	Shall carry out those powers and duties concerning the
14		valley reserve otherwise conferred upon the island
15		burial councils and the department with regard to
16		proper treatment of burial sites and human skeletal
17		remains found in the valley reserve;
18	(9)	Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that
19		are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and
20		shall maintain a record of its proceedings and
21		actions; and

1 (10)May delegate to the executive director or employees of the commission, by formal commission action, such 2 power and authority vested in the commission by this 3 chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper 4 for the effective administration of this chapter. 5 -7 Interim activities of the commission. Prior to the 6 7 return of Makua valley from the United States Army to the State, 8 the commission may enter into discussions with the Army to 9 facilitate the expedient return of Makua valley upon the expiration of the Army's lease. 10 11 -8 Penalty. Any person who violates any of the laws or rules applicable to the valley reserve shall be guilty of a 12 13 petty misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, for each offense. 14 15 Each day of each violation shall be deemed a separate offense. § -9 General administrative penalties. (a) 16 17 otherwise provided by law, the commission may set, charge, and collect administrative fines, or bring legal action to recover 18 administrative costs of the commission or the department, or 19 20 payment for damages, or for the cost to correct damages resulting from a violation of this chapter or any rule adopted 21 The administrative fines shall be as follows: 22 thereunder.

- 3 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous4 violation, by a fine of not more than \$15,000; and
- 5 (3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years 6 of the last violation, by a fine of not more than 7 \$25,000.
- **8** (b) In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000
- 9 may be levied for each specimen of natural resource or any
- 10 historic property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in
- 11 violation of any rule adopted under this chapter. For purposes
- 12 of this section, "natural resource" includes any archaeological
- 13 artifacts, minerals, any aquatic life or wildlife or parts
- 14 thereof, including their eggs, and any land plants or parts
- 15 thereof, including seeds. Also for purposes of this section,
- 16 "historic property" means any building, structure, object,
- 17 districts, area, or site, including heiau and underwater site,
- 18 which is over fifty years old.
- 19 (c) Any criminal penalty for any violation of this chapter
- 20 or any rule adopted under this chapter shall not be deemed to
- 21 preclude the commission from bringing a civil legal action to
- 22 recover additional administrative fines and costs. Any civil

- 1 legal action against a person to recover administrative fines
- 2 and costs for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
- 3 under this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the State
- 4 from pursuing any criminal action against that person.
- 5 (d) In any judicial proceeding to recover an
- 6 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show
- 7 that notice was given, that a hearing was held or the time
- 8 granted for requesting a hearing has run without such a request,
- 9 that an administrative penalty was imposed, and that the
- 10 administrative penalty remains unpaid.
- 11 § -10 Transfer. Upon its return to the State, the
- 12 resources of Makua valley shall be held in trust as part of the
- 13 public land trust; provided that the State shall transfer
- 14 management and control of the valley to the sovereign native
- 15 Hawaiian entity upon its recognition by the United States and
- 16 the State of Hawaii.
- 17 All terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting the
- 18 Makua valley, including any ongoing obligations relating to the
- 19 clean-up of the valleys, shall remain in effect unless expressly
- 20 terminated.
- 21 § -11 Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund. (a)
- 22 There is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be

- 1 designated as the Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund to be
- 2 administered by the department with the prior approval of the
- 3 commission. Subject to this chapter, all moneys received from
- 4 the federal government for the rehabilitation and environmental
- 5 restoration of the Makua valley, any moneys appropriated by the
- 6 legislature to the trust fund, any proceeds from administrative
- 7 fines imposed and collected under this chapter, and the interest
- 8 or return on investments earned from moneys in the trust fund,
- 9 shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
- 10 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
- 11 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
- 12 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
- 13 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
- 14 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.
- 15 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
- 16 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
- 17 the trust fund is repealed.
- 18 (d) The trust fund shall be repealed on July 1, 2045. The
- 19 commission shall transfer to the credit of the state general
- 20 fund, all unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining in the
- 21 trust fund prior to June 30, 2045; provided that all unexpended

- 1 or unencumbered balances of federal moneys shall be disbursed in
- 2 accordance with applicable federal law.
- 3 § -12 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
- 4 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 5 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
- 6 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without
- 7 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 8 provisions of this chapter are severable."
- 9 SECTION 2. It is the express intent of the legislature and
- 10 this Act to not obstruct, deny, or revoke any rights or
- 11 privileges heretofore exercised by the United States Army in its
- 12 use of the Makua valley throughout the term of its lease.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
