A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the homeless and
- 2 affordable housing crises continue to be two of the State's most
- 3 significant and challenging social problems.
- 4 The most recent estimate of the total number of homeless
- 5 persons in the State is six thousand twenty-nine on any given
- 6 day. In addition, the Hawaii Homeless Point-in-Time Study of
- 7 2003 found that over four thousand of these homeless persons are
- 8 unsheltered. This is indicative of the limited shelter space
- 9 available in the State.
- 10 Also troubling is the fact that a staggering thirty-seven
- 11 per cent of the unsheltered homeless are individuals of Hawaiian
- 12 or part-Hawaiian ancestry. Equally troubling is the fact that
- 13 on any given day, there are eight hundred thirty-eight homeless
- 14 children in the State. None of these numbers reflect the number
- 15 of people who are considered hidden homeless or those who are
- 16 at-risk of homelessness.

1 Housing, in general, is a critical issue for many residents 2 in Hawaii, where the costs of homeownership and rental are increasing. The prospect of making high mortgage payments and 3 4 saving enough money for the downpayment and closing costs needed to buy a home at current market prices is a formidable 5 challenge. Even higher income families must often seek help 6 7 from relatives to overcome this obstacle. More needs to be done to increase the inventory of and ensure that residents have 8 9 access to affordable housing as well. To assist in alleviating these problems, the legislature 10 11 enacted Act 222, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, the Housing Omnibus Act, which placed priority on sheltering the homeless 12 and providing more affordable housing opportunities for Hawaii's 13 citizens. The legislature recognizes the meaningful solutions 14 provided by Act 222, and seeks with this Act, to further 15 16 ameliorate Hawaii's housing and homeless problems. The purpose of this Act is to repeal the sunset date for 17 18 the allocation of the conveyance tax to the rental housing trust

fund, and provide funding for various public housing and

homeless programs.

                    (a) The legislature finds that public housing

    projects are continuing to deteriorate due to a lack of timely

    maintenance and repair. As a consequence, housing units are in
12
    danger of becoming or have already become uninhabitable.
         Additional repair and maintenance funding is needed to
13
    supplement the Hawaii public housing authority's annual
14

    recurring repair and maintenance budget. Currently, the public
    housing authority receives $1,500,000 annually for repair and
16

    maintenance; however, these funds are insufficient to keep
18
    public housing units in decent, sanitary, and livable
19
    conditions. An additional $2,000,000 for repair and maintenance
20
    is required this year, and for all subsequent years, in order
    for the authority to satisfactorily maintain these vital housing

    resources.

- 1 (b) There is appropriated out of the general revenues of
- 2 the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as
- 3 may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the Hawaii public
- 4 housing authority to conduct repair and maintenance on public
- 5 housing projects.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 7 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 9 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$40,200,000 or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year
- 12 2008-2009 for the Hawaii public housing authority to conduct
- 13 capital improvement projects to repair and renovate public
- 14 housing.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 16 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. (a) The legislature finds that improved safety
- 18 measures are needed at public housing projects. While the 2007
- 19 Hawaii state legislature appropriated general funds for public
- 20 housing security needs, additional funding is required to
- 21 sufficiently address the arduous security problems plaquing
- 22 housing projects. It is the intent of this legislature to

- 1 continue the work begun in the 2007 regular session by
- 2 appropriating funds for security in order to protect physical
- 3 public housing property as well as create a safer environment
- 4 for public housing tenants and the surrounding community.
- 5 (b) There is appropriated out of the general revenues of
- 6 the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much thereof as
- 7 may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for providing
- 8 security in public housing projects.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 10 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,300,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to the
- 14 Hawaii public housing authority for outreach or support
- 15 services, or both, to unsheltered homeless, at-risk homeless,
- 16 and those residing in homeless facilities, including emergency
- 17 shelters, pursuant to the purchase of service agreements under
- 18 chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes. This appropriation shall
- 19 be used for the provision of continual operational funds to
- 20 provide matching funds for shelter plus care grants and
- 21 supportive housing programs and operational funds for nonprofit
- 22 agencies to develop affordable housing.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 2 housing authority for purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 7. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 4 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$32,000,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much as may
- 6 be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year 2008-2009 to the
- 7 Hawaii public housing authority for homeless facilities,
- 8 emergency shelters, and transitional shelters, as defined by
- 9 section 356D-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, on the islands of
- 10 Oahu and Hawaii.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 12 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 8. The appropriations made in sections 3, 4, 5, 6,
- 14 and 7 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year
- 15 for which the appropriation is made; provided that all
- 16 appropriations that are unencumbered as of June 30, 2011, shall
- 17 lapse as of that date into the appropriate fund.
- 18 SECTION 9. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 19 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 20 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 21 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the

- 1 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 2 of this Act are severable.
- 3 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken.
- 5 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
