A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HONEY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to ensure that honey products are recognized by the State as agricultural 2 3 commodities. SECTION 2. Chapter 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending the title of part I to read as follows: 5 6 "PART I. FRESH FRUITS [AND], VEGETABLES, 7 NUTS, HONEY, AND COFFEE" SECTION 3. Section 147-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended as follows: 10 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 11 and to read: 12 ""Raw honey" and "unprocessed honey" means honey that has 13 not been heated above one hundred twenty degrees Fahrenheit, or 14 filtered through a fine screen of less than one-sixty-fourth inch mesh, or treated with diatomaceous earth, or in any other 15 way that results in the loss of any natural constituent of honey 16

By amending the definition of "agricultural commodity" 1 2 to read: ""Agricultural commodity" means fresh fruits and fresh 3 vegetables of every kind and character, whether or not frozen or 4 packed in ice, whether produced in the State or imported, nuts, 5 and coffee, whether cherry[7] or parchment, or green beans which 6 7 have been produced in the State[+], and raw unprocessed honey, 8 whether produced in the State or imported." 9 SECTION 4. Chapter 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending the title of part II to read as follows: 10 11 "PART II. EXPORTS: FRUITS, VEGETABLES, NUTS, [AND] COFFEE, AND HONEY" 12 SECTION 5. Section 147-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended as follows: 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 15 16 and to read: ""Raw honey" and "unprocessed honey" means honey that has 17 not been heated above one hundred twenty degrees Fahrenheit, or 18 filtered through a fine screen of less than one-sixty-fourth 19 20 inch mesh, or treated with diatomaceous earth, or in any other

- 10 one hundred twenty degrees Fahrenheit, or filtered through a
- 11 fine screen of less than one-sixty-fourth inch mesh, or treated
- 12 with diatomaceous earth, or in any other way that results in the
- 13 loss of any natural constituent of honey such as plant pollen
- 14 and enzymes."
- 15 2. By amending the definition of "food product" or
- 16 "product" to read:
- ""Food product" or "product" means any and all fruits,
- 18 vegetables, nuts, and coffee, or part or parts thereof, produced
- 19 and processed within the State, any and all honey produced and
- 20 processed within the State or imported, and also any and all
- 21 fish and fishery products processed within the State;"
