A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides 2 appropriate authorities, including the board of education, 3 sufficient flexibility to adjust the wages, hours, benefits, and 4 other terms and conditions of employment for employees who are 5 excluded from collective bargaining. Under the law, these 6 appropriate authorities cannot adjust the wages and other 7 benefits that are set by statute. 8 Within the department of education, substitute teachers are 9 part-time, casual, and intermittent employees who are excluded 10 from collective bargaining. 11 The purpose of this Act is to provide and appropriate funds 12 for periodic wage adjustments for substitute teachers that are 13 comparable to the wage adjustments negotiated for teachers in 14 bargaining unit 5, and to enable the board of education to adjust the hours, benefits, and other terms and conditions of 15

employment for substitute teachers.

14		teacher earns the credit requirement for the three-
15		year cycle;
16	(3)	Any credit earned in excess of any three-year credit
17		requirement may not be carried over beyond the three-
18		year cycle; and
19	(4)	Credits earned can be in the form of in-service,
20		university, or other credits approved by the
21		department.

- 1 (c) A teacher is required to spend at least one year in
 2 Class III before going on to Class IV, at least one year in
 3 Class IV before going on to Class V, at least one year in Class
 4 V before going on to Class VI, and at least one year in Class VI
 5 before going on to Class VII.
- 6 (d) In case of promotion from a teaching position to an
 7 educational officer, the employee shall receive compensation at
 8 the lowest step of the higher grade that exceeds the employee's
 9 existing compensation by at least eight per cent if such a step
 10 exists.
- (e) Effective July 1, 2006, the minimum hourly or minimum

 per diem rate for substitute teachers shall be determined by the

 legislature as follows; provided that any individual in class I,

 II, or III who works less than a full seven-hour work day shall

 be compensated on a pro-rated, hourly basis:
- 16 (1) Class I: other individuals who do not possess a

 17 bachelor's degree shall be compensated at a rate of

 18 not less than \$125 for a full work day;
- 19 (2) Class II: individuals with a bachelor's degree shall
 20 be compensated at a rate of not less than \$136 for a
