
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "~~§103D-110~~ **Education and training.** (a) The department of
4 human resources development, either alone or in cooperation with
5 any governmental body, including the department of labor and
6 industrial relations, or in cooperation with other states, the
7 federal government, or other persons may:

8 [~~(1)~~] ~~Develop and maintain a comprehensive training and~~
9 ~~development program for procurement professionals of~~
10 ~~the State and the several counties;~~

11 ~~(2)~~ (1) Conduct or participate in procurement education
12 and training for persons not employed by the State;
13 and

14 [~~(3)~~] (2) Sponsor a purchasing certification program
15 conducted by a voluntary organization of procurement
16 professionals.



1 (b) The state procurement office, in cooperation with the
2 department of human resources development, shall develop and
3 maintain a procurement practices training and development
4 program for procurement officers of the State and the several
5 counties. Attendance shall be mandatory for state procurement
6 officers to ensure that their agency's procurement practices are
7 in compliance with the procurement code and that proper
8 procurement decisions are made consistent with this chapter.
9 Attendance by county procurement officials shall be elective."

10 SECTION 2. Section 103D-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12 "(b) The state procurement policy board shall consist of
13 seven members. Notwithstanding the limitations of section 78-4,
14 the members of the board shall include:

- 15 (1) The comptroller[+] as an ex-officio nonvoting member;
16 (2) A county employee with significant high-level
17 procurement experience; and
18 (3) Five persons who shall not otherwise be full-time
19 employees of the State or any county; provided that at
20 least one member shall be a certified professional in
21 the field of procurement, at least one member shall
22 have significant high-level, federal procurement



1 experience, and at least two members shall have
2 significant experience in the field of health and
3 human services.

4 Each appointed member shall have demonstrated sufficient
5 business or professional experience to discharge the functions
6 of the state procurement policy board. The initial and
7 subsequent members of the state procurement policy board, other
8 than the comptroller, shall be appointed by the governor from a
9 list of three individuals for each vacant position, submitted by
10 a nominating committee composed of four individuals chosen as
11 follows: two persons appointed by the governor; one person
12 appointed by the president of the senate; and one person
13 appointed by the speaker of the house. Except as provided in
14 this section, the selection and terms of the state procurement
15 policy board members shall be subject to the requirements of
16 section 26-34. No member of the state procurement policy board
17 shall act concurrently as a chief procurement officer. The
18 members of the state procurement policy board shall devote such
19 time to their duties as may be necessary for the proper
20 discharge thereof."

21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Procurement; Mandatory Training

Description:

Clarifies that comptroller serves as ex-officio nonvoting member of state procurement policy board. Requires state procurement officers to attend procurement training developed and maintained by the state procurement office. Makes training elective for county procurement officials. (SB2826 SD2)
