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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE  
TWENTY-FIRST SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$50,420,220, or so much  
3 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum, or so much  
4 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year  
5 2008-2009, for the purpose of capital improvement projects for  
6 the twenty-first senatorial district, as follows:

8 Demolition of existing structure

9 and construction of a new

10 community center.

11         SECTION 2.   The appropriation made for the capital  
12         improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at  
13         the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;  
14         provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as  
15         of June 30, 2010, shall lapse as of that date.

16         SECTION 3.   The sums appropriated for the respective  
17         capital improvement projects set forth in section 1 shall be  
18         expended by the department of education for the purposes of this  
19         Act; provided that:

20                 (1)   The sums appropriated for items 1 and 14 shall be  
21                         expended by the department of Hawaiian homelands for  
22                         the purposes of this Act;




1 (2) The sum appropriated for item 4 shall be expended by  
2 the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act;

3 (3) The sum appropriated for item 8 shall be expended by  
4 the department of transportation for the purposes of  
5 this Act;

6 (4) The sums appropriated for items 9, 10, and 19 shall be  
7 expended by the department of land and natural  
8 resources for the purposes of this Act; and

9 (5) The sum appropriated for item 15 shall be expended by  
10 the Wai'anae coast comprehensive health center for the  
11 purposes of this Act.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
