A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KAWAI NUI MARSH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Kawai Nui marsh, encompassing approximately
2	eight hundred thirty acres of land in Kailua, Oahu, is the
3	State's largest remaining wetland and an ecological and cultural
4	treasure. It has been identified by the United States Fish and
5	Wildlife Service as a primary habitat for endemic and endangered
6	native Hawaiian birds such as the 'alae ke'oke'o, 'alae 'ula,
7	ae'o, and koloa maoli. In 2005, the Ramsar Convention on
8	Wetlands designated Kawai Nui marsh a wetland of international
9	importance in part due to the wetlands relationship to
10	surrounding cultural sites.
11	Act 314, Session Laws of Hawaii 1990 (Act 314), directed

- the transfer to the State of that certain parcel owned by the city and county of Honolulu and bearing tax map key number 4-2-16:1, which encompasses the bulk of Kawai Nui marsh. The parties were unsuccessful in completing the transfer.
- Since the passage of Act 314, the health of the marsh has declined significantly despite the advocacy and restoration

- 1 efforts of community groups such as 'Ahahui Malama I Ka Lokahi,
- 2 Hawaii's Thousand Friends, the Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club,
- 3 Kailua Historical Society, Kawai Nui Heritage Foundation, and
- 4 the Windward Ahupua'a Alliance.
- 5 Act 235, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, again addressed the
- 6 transfer of this parcel to the State, and the city and county of
- 7 Honolulu is currently in negotiations with the State to complete
- 8 the transfer of title.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to ensure continued community
- 10 participation in the preservation, protection, and future vision
- 11 for Kawai Nui marsh.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 14 and to read as follows:
- 15 "§171- Kawai Nui marsh advisory council. (a) There is
- 16 established a Kawai Nui marsh advisory council, to be placed
- 17 within the department of land and natural resources for
- 18 administrative purposes only. The advisory council shall
- 19 consist of eleven voting members appointed by the governor in
- 20 accordance with section 26-34, and six ex-officio members as
- 21 follows:

1	(1)	One representative from 'Ahahui Malama I Ka Lokahi or
2		their designee;
3	(2)	One representative from the Kailua Chamber of
4		Commerce;
5	(3)	Four representatives from environmental or educational
6		nonprofit organizations;
7	(4)	Two cultural representatives appointed by the Kailua
8		Hawaiian Civic Club and 'Ahahui Malama I Ka Lokahi;
9	<u>(5)</u>	Two community representatives;
10	<u>(6)</u>	One landowner representative;
11	<u>(7)</u>	Five ex-officio members representing the United States
12		Army Corps of Engineers, United States Fish and
13		Wildlife Service, the department of land and natural
14		resources forestry and wildlife division, the
15		department of land and natural resources state parks
16		division, and the city and county of Honolulu; and
17	<u>(8)</u>	One ex-officio member who is a student representative
18		from a Kailua area school as selected by a high school
19		council.
20	(b)	Each member representing an organization shall be
21	appointed	by the director or other chief executive of the
22	member's	organization within days following July 1, 2008.

1	The membe	ers of the advisory council shall not receive
2	compensat	ion for their service but shall be reimbursed for
3	expenses,	including travel expenses, incurred in their duties
4	relating	to the advisory council.
5	<u>(c)</u>	A chairperson shall be elected annually by the council
6	from amon	g the council's voting members; provided that:
7	(1)	Only a nongovernmental member shall be elected as
8		chairperson; and
9	(2)	No member may serve as chairperson for more than two
10		consecutive years.
11	<u>(d)</u>	Six voting members shall constitute a quorum to do
12	business	and any action taken by the advisory council shall be
13	validated	by a simple majority of the quorum.
14	<u>(e)</u>	The Kawai Nui marsh advisory council shall:
15	(1)	Review and assist in updating and revising the 1994
16		Kawai Nui marsh master plan, which should consider the
17		Hamakua wetlands, adjacent waterways that enter into
18		Kawai Nui marsh from Maunawili and Kapa'a valleys and
19		flow into Kailua Bay;
20	(2)	Facilitate implementation of the master plan;
21	(3)	Enhance community education and cultural awareness of
22		Kawai Nui marsh; and

(4) Participate in the protection and preservation of 1 Kawai Nui marsh's natural and cultural resources." 2 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 4 or so 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to 6 support the work of the Kawai Nui marsh advisory council, including the revising of the 1994 Kawai Nui Marsh Master Plan. 7 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 9 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act. 10 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
