A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§4-1 Districts, generally.** For election, taxation,
4 education, city, county, and all other purposes, the State shall
5 be divided into the following districts; provided that the
6 establishment of election districts shall be exclusively
7 governed by article IV of the [~~constitution~~] Constitution of the
8 State of Hawaii and chapter 25:

9 (1) The island and county of Hawaii shall be divided into
10 nine districts as follows:

11 (A) Puna, to be styled the Puna district;

12 (B) From the Hakalau stream to the boundary of South
13 Hilo and Puna, to be styled the South Hilo
14 district;

15 (C) From the boundary of Hamakua and North Hilo to
16 the Hakalau stream, to be styled the North Hilo
17 district;



- 1 (D) Hamakua, to be styled the Hamakua district;
 - 2 (E) North Kohala, to be styled the North Kohala
 - 3 district;
 - 4 (F) South Kohala, to be styled the South Kohala
 - 5 district;
 - 6 (G) North Kona, to be styled the North Kona district;
 - 7 (H) South Kona, to be styled the South Kona district;
 - 8 and
 - 9 (I) Kau, to be styled the Kau district.
- 10 (2) The islands of Maui, Molokai, Lanai, and Kahoolawe and
- 11 the counties of Maui and Kalawao shall be divided into
- 12 seven districts as follows:
- 13 (A) Kahikinui, Kaupo, Kipahulu, Hana, and Koolau, to
 - 14 be styled the Hana district;
 - 15 (B) Hamakualoa, Hamakuapoko, portion of Kula, and
 - 16 Honuaula, the western boundary being a line
 - 17 starting from the sea at Kapukaulua on the
 - 18 boundary between the ahupuaas of Haliimaile and
 - 19 Wailuku, thence running inland following the
 - 20 boundary to the mauka side of the Lowrie ditch,
 - 21 thence following the mauka side of the ditch and
 - 22 its projected extension to the Waiakoa gulch



1 which is the boundary between the ahupuaas of
2 Pulehunui and Waiakoa, thence down along the
3 boundary to the mauka boundary of the Waiakoa
4 Homesteads (makai section), thence along the
5 boundary to the ahupuaa of Kaonoulu, thence
6 across the ahupuaa of Kaonoulu to the mauka
7 boundary of the Waiohuli-Keokea Beach Homesteads,
8 thence along the boundary to the mauka boundary
9 of the Kamaole Homesteads, thence along the
10 boundary and the extension thereof to the north
11 boundary of the ahupuaa of Paeahu, thence along
12 the boundary to the sea, and including the island
13 of Kahoolawe, to be styled the Makawao district;

14 (C) All that portion of central Maui lying east of a
15 line along the boundary of the ahupuaas of
16 Kahakuloa and Honokohau to the peak of Eke
17 crater, thence along the ridge of mountains and
18 down the bottom of Manawainui gulch to the sea,
19 and west of the boundary of Makawao district, to
20 be styled Wailuku district;

21 (D) All that portion of Maui lying west of Wailuku
22 district, to be styled the Lahaina district;



- 1 (E) The island of Molokai, except that portion of the
- 2 island known as Kalaupapa, Kalawao, and Waikolu
- 3 and commonly known or designated as the
- 4 Settlement for Hansen's disease sufferers, to be
- 5 styled the Molokai district;
- 6 (F) All that portion of the island of Molokai known
- 7 as Kalaupapa, Kalawao, and Waikolu forming the
- 8 county of Kalawao, to be styled the Kalawao
- 9 district; and
- 10 (G) The island of Lanai, to be styled the Lanai
- 11 district.
- 12 (3) For judicial purposes, the island of Oahu shall be
- 13 divided into seven districts as follows:
- 14 (A) From Makapuu Head in Maunalua to Moanalua
- 15 inclusive, and the islands not included in any
- 16 other district, to be styled the Honolulu
- 17 district;
- 18 (B) Ewa, excluding Waikakalaua, Waipio Acres, and
- 19 Mililani Town, to be styled the Ewa district;
- 20 (C) Waianae excluding Waianae Uka, to be styled the
- 21 Waianae district;



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- 1 (D) From Kaena point to and including Waialeale Stream
2 excluding Wahiaua, hereinafter described, to be
3 styled the Waialua district;
- 4 (E) From Waialeale Stream to Lae o ka Oio, to be styled
5 the Koolauloa district;
- 6 (F) From Lae o ka Oio to Makapuu Head in Waimanalo,
7 to be styled the Koolaupoko district;
- 8 (G) Wahiaua and Waianae Uka, including Waikakalaua,
9 Waipio Acres, and Mililani Town, lying between
10 Ewa and Waialua districts and more particularly
11 described in the following manner: Beginning at
12 Puu Kaaumakua in the Koolau range and running to
13 and along the south boundary of Waianae Uka
14 (which is also the south boundary of Schofield
15 Barracks Military Reservation) to Puu Hapapa in
16 the Waianae range; thence continuing along
17 Schofield Barracks Military Reservation northerly
18 along the Waianae range to Puu Kaala, easterly
19 along Mokuleia down ridge to Puu Pane, continuing
20 to Maili Trig. station, and down ridge to
21 Haleauau stream and down Haleauau stream to
22 Kaukonahua gulch, and easterly along the gulch to



1 the west boundary of the ahupuaa of Wahiawa;
2 thence leaving Schofield Barracks Military
3 Reservation and following up and along the west
4 and north boundaries of the ahupuaa of Wahiawa to
5 the Koolau range; thence along the Koolau range
6 to the beginning; to be styled the Wahiawa
7 district.

8 (4) For all purposes except for judicial, the island of
9 Oahu shall be divided into seven districts as follows:

10 (A) From Makapuu Head in Maunaloa to Moanalua
11 inclusive, and the islands not included in any
12 other district, to be styled the Honolulu
13 district;

14 (B) Ewa, to be styled the Ewa district;

15 (C) Waianae excluding Waianae Uka, to be styled the
16 Waianae district;

17 (D) From Kaena point to and including the ahupuaa of
18 Waimea excluding Wahiawa, hereinafter described,
19 to be styled the Waialua district;

20 (E) From Waimea to Lae o ka Oio, to be styled the
21 Koolauloa district;



1 (F) From Lae o ka Oio to Makapuu Head in Waimanalo,
2 to be styled the Koolaupoko district;

3 (G) Wahiawa and Waianae Uka, lying between Ewa and
4 Waialua districts and more particularly described
5 in the following manner: Beginning at Puu
6 Kaaumakua in the Koolau range and running to and
7 along the south boundary of Waianae Uka (which is
8 also the south boundary of Schofield Barracks
9 Military Reservation) to Puu Hapapa in the
10 Waianae range; thence continuing along Schofield
11 Barracks Military Reservation northerly along the
12 Waianae range to Puu Kaala, easterly along
13 Mokuleia down ridge to Puu Pane, continuing to
14 Maili Trig. station, and down ridge to Haleauau
15 stream and down Haleauau stream to Kaukonahua
16 gulch, and easterly along the gulch to the west
17 boundary of the ahupuaa of Wahiawa; thence
18 leaving Schofield Barracks Military Reservation
19 and following up and along the west and north
20 boundaries of the ahupuaa of Wahiawa to the
21 Koolau range; thence along the Koolau range to
22 the beginning; to be styled the Wahiawa district.



1 (5) The islands of Kauai, Niihau, Kaula, and county of
2 Kauai, shall be divided into five districts as
3 follows:

4 (A) From Puanaaiea point to the ili of Eleele,
5 including the islands of Niihau and Kaula, to be
6 styled the Waimea district;

7 (B) From and including the ili of Eleele to and
8 including Mahaulepu, to be styled the Koloa
9 district;

10 (C) From and including Kipu to the northerly bank of
11 the north fork and the main Wailua river, to be
12 styled the Lihue district;

13 (D) From the northerly bank of the north fork and the
14 main Wailua river to Kealaakaiole, to be styled
15 the Kawaihau district; and

16 (E) From and including Kealaakaiole to Puanaaiea
17 point to be styled the Hanalei district."

18 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
