RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the recent changes 2 to the federal temporary assistance for needy families program 3 rules and subsequent first-to-work program changes, which limit 4 educational activities to two years of study leading to vocational or technical degrees in order to meet federal work 5 requirements, grandfathers currently participating students and 6 allows them to finish their education. | 21 | is attending; provided that the approved course of |

study shall not be limited to vocational education;

Bridge to Hope; Educational Activities

Description:

Expands the bridge to hope program to enable heads of households receiving financial assistance and participating in the first-to-work programs to pursue educational activities beyond the new two-year federal limit. (SD2)
