- affairs under this section overlap with the responsibilities or 1 2 duties of another agency or authority under this chapter, the 3 office of international affairs shall have exclusive 4 jurisdiction and authority over those responsibilities and 5 duties. 6 (d) There is established a committee to be known as the peace mission committee, which shall be placed within the office 7 8 of international affairs for administrative purposes. The 9 purpose of the peace mission committee shall be to plan and 10 develop: (1) Peace missions to other nations and international 11 organizations, particularly with nations and 12 organizations that are engaged in conflict with the 13 14 United States; 15 (2) Cultural exchange and goodwill programs with other 16 nations' education, business, and community sectors; 17 and 18 (3) Charitable donation programs with other nations, 19 provided that the programs do not violate any treaties 20 or international policies involving the United States. 21 The committee shall be a permanent body within the 22 department of business, economic development, and tourism. 1 committee shall consist of seven members who shall be appointed, 2 without regard to section 26-34. The committee members shall 3 include members from the private, public, community at large, and academic sectors. The speaker of the house of 4 representatives shall select two members. The president of the 5 senate shall select two members. The governor shall select 6 7 three members. 8 The members shall not receive compensation for their 9 services but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their 10 11 duties under this subsection. Any member of the committee shall be immune from civil liability, as provided for under section 12 13 26-35.5. In its efforts to conduct peace missions, initiate cultural 14 15 exchange and goodwill programs, and develop charitable donation 16 programs with other nations and international organizations, the committee may seek grants from public and private sources and 17 18 may accept donations to finance its projects, programs, and activities. The director of business, economic development, and 19 20 tourism may direct any or as many employees the director deems

appropriate to staff the committee.

- 2 activities on an annual basis to the legislature no later than
- 3 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
- 4 beginning with the regular session of 2009."
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be used
- 8 by the peace mission committee for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 11 this Act.

Description:

Establishes a peace mission committee within the office of international affairs to plan and implement peace missions to other nations and organizations; appropriates funds. (SD1)
